Freeman Elects School Board Members

FREEMAN — The school election was delayed a week, but Freeman voters chose two board members Tuesday.

The election was postponed because of inclement weather and rescheduled for Tuesday.

Newcomer Cory Schrag and incumbent Laverne Diede won the two three-year terms on the board with a respective 212 and 181 votes, according to Freeman school business manager Ronda Rinehart.

The third candidate, newcomer Daniel Waldhauser, received 102 votes.

Diede was the only incumbent running the race because another incumbent, Brian Anderson, did seek re-election, according to Rinehart.

Diede spent 30 years as Freeman elementary principal and four years as a part-time assistant principal in Marion, according to the Freeman Courier. Schrag has a livestock operation east of Freeman, while Waldhauser is a Freeman city resident who owns his own remodeling business, the Courier said.

Tuesday's election drew 272 of 1,846 registered voters for a 15 percent turnout, Rinehart said.

Lake Andes Man Sentenced To 4 Years For Sexual Abuse

LAKE ANDES — A Lake Andes man charged with sexual abuse was sentenced this week to four years in custody.

Ray Flying Hawk, age 43, was indicted for sexual abuse by a federal grand jury on Aug. 14, 2012, and pled guilty Jan. 15.

He was sentenced Monday by U.S. District Judge Karen E. Schreier, according to a press release from U.S. Attorney Brendan V. Johnson of Sioux Falls.

In April 2012, Flying Hawk engaged in a sexual act with a person who was incapable of appraising the nature of the conduct and physically incapable of communicating an unwillingness to engage in such act.

This case was investigated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Law Enforcement Services — Yankton Agency and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas J. Wright prosecuted the case.

Flying Hawk was immediately turned over to the custody of the U.S. Marshal.
