Trial Date Set In Springfield Arson Case

TYNDALL — The trial for a Niobrara, Neb., couple charged with starting their own Springfield business on fire has been postponed until next month, according to a court official.

Charles Johnson and Kimberly Johnson are both charged with second-degree arson and reckless burning in the October 2010 early-morning fire that destroyed two downtown Springfield businesses — including their steakhouse — and damaged a third one. No one was injured in the fire.

Both charges are Class 4 felonies, each carrying a maximum penalty of 10 years in the state penitentiary and a \$20,000 fine.

The trial proceedings had been scheduled to begin next week but are now rescheduled for the week of May 20, according to Bon Homme County Clerk of Courts Joanne Balvin.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly rose Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery rose 0.25 cent to \$7.0375 a bushel; May corn fell 2.75 cents to \$6.605 a bushel; May oats rose 11.75 cents to \$3.865 a bushel; while May soybeans rose 10.75 cents to \$14.2225 a bushel.

Beef and pork prices rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle added 1.37 cent to \$1.2182 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 0.85 cent to \$1.409 a pound; June lean hogs rose 1.33 cent to 90.35 cents a pound.

LOTTERIES

Due to the inclement weather, lottery results were not available at press time. Full results from Wednesday's drawings will be published in Friday's Press & Dakotan.

The trial was rescheduled to last January, then further delayed to next week.

The defendants are represented by court-appointed attorneys, according to the clerk's office. Yankton attorney Creighton Thurman represents Kimberly Johnson, while Menno attorney Ken Bertsch represents Charles Johnson.

The prosecution will be represented by Bon Homme County State's Attorney Lisa Rothschadl and a member of the South Dakota attorney general's office.

The Johnsons were indicted in First Circuit Court in Tyndall. The indictments charge the couple with allegedly starting the fire to collect insurance.

Warrants were issued for the Johnsons, and they were arrested in April 2012 by the Knox County, Neb., sheriff's office. The Johnsons each posted \$5,000 cash bond and were released. The Johnsons waived extradition.
