TYNDALL — The trial for a Niobrara, Neb., couple charged with starting their own Springfield business on fire has been postponed until next month, according to a court official.

Charles Johnson and Kimberly Johnson are both charged with second-degree arson and reckless burning in the October 2010 early-morning fire that destroyed two downtown Springfield businesses — including their steakhouse — and damaged a third one. No one was injured in the fire.

Both charges are Class 4 felonies, each carrying a maximum penalty of 10 years in the state penitentiary and a \$20,000

The trial proceedings had been scheduled to begin next week but are now rescheduled for the week of May 20, according to Bon Homme County Clerk of Courts Joanne Balvin.

The Johnsons have each pleaded not guilty to the charges. The defendants are scheduled to stand trial together, Balvin said.

The Johnsons' trial had been scheduled to begin last August in Tyndall, but the judge granted a defense motion for a continuance. In addition, Charles Johnson made a motion to allow the hiring of an expert witness, according to court papers.


