Before retiring, Eli agreed to help train a new employee for

the auditor's office and has followed through with that promise.

Meanwhile, Patty Hojem, a long-serving employee in the auditor's office, will take over as chief deputy in May.

Eli hopes an auditor is back in the office soon.

"Three people can't do the work of four," she said. Looking ahead to retirement,

Eli said she has no big plans.
"I'm just going to take it day by day and enjoy things," she said. "If it's nice on May 1, I'm going to walk across the (Meridian) bridge. I'd really enjoy that."


