

## WIC Program Announces New Income Guidelines

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Health has released new income guidelines for the WIC Program effective April 1, 2014.

WIC is a special supplemental nutrition program, funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, provided at no cost to eligible moms, babies and children. Its goal is to help improve health by providing nutritious foods to supplement diets, offering education on healthy eating, nutrition and breastfeeding, and making referrals to other services.

If your family income does not exceed the following amounts for the size of your family, you could qualify for

WIC (listed as family size/185 percent of federal poverty level): 1 — \$21,590; 2 — \$29,101; 3 — \$36,612; 4 — \$44,123; 5 — \$51,634; 6 — \$59,145; 7 — \$66,656; 8 — \$74,167; 9 — \$81,678; 10 — \$89,189

To find out if you or your children are eligible for the WIC Program, call for an appointment at your local WIC Office/Community Health Services Office. Offices can be found under the county listings in your phone book or on the web at <http://doh.sd.gov/local-offices/community-health-wic/>.

At the appointment you will be asked to provide family

income information, proof of residency and identity, and information about past and current health. You will also be required to measure your height and weight, take a finger stick blood test and visit with a health professional about nutrition education and health needs. Infants up to 9 months of age will not be required to take a blood test. If eligible, you will get food "checks" to buy foods at authorized grocery stores.

City crews will pick up the materials that have been placed at the curb on April 7-11. This service is only available for residential customers on the regular city garbage collection routes.

### Rosella "Sally" Bart

Sally Bart, age 94 of Hartington, Nebraska, died on Tuesday, April 1, 2014 at the Golden Living Center in Hartington.

Mass of Christian Burial will be on Friday, April 4, 2014 at 10:30 a.m. at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Hartington, NE with the Rev. Jeffery Loseke officiating. Burial will be at St. Michael's cemetery in Hartington. Military rites will be conducted by the Hartington VFW Post #5283, the American Freedom Riders, and the Crofton American Legion Post #128.

Visitation will be on Thursday from 4:00 p.m. with a Vigil Service at 6:00 p.m. at the Wintz Funeral Home in Hartington. Visitation will continue on Friday morning at church one hour prior to services.

Rosella (Sally) J. Bart, daughter of Frank and Anna (Bogner) Bart, was born on October 2, 1919 on the family farm east of Crofton, NE. She attended elementary school at St. Rose and graduated from Crofton High School in 1937. Sally attended Omaha School of Commerce and was employed in Omaha, Denver, and Chicago. On January 22, 1943, she joined the WAAC (Women's Auxiliary Army Corporation), becoming the first woman in Cedar County to join the military. Basic training was in Ft. Oglethorpe, GA, and administration school was in Conway, AR. On September 1, 1943, the WAAC was renamed the Women's Army Corp. From April 9, 1944 to October 20, 1945, Sally served her country in E.T.O. (European Theatre of Operations) in England and France during WWII. It was during that period while working in the mailroom that she realized her brother, Raymond Bart was killed in action. On November 6, 1945, she was discharged at Ft. Sheridan, IL, having completed her tour of duty.

After returning to civilian life, Sally was employed at BF Goodrich in Chicago, as well as other places until 1950 when she returned to Nebraska. She worked at the Ford Garage in Hartington as a bookkeeper for four years. During this time she also cared for her sister, Katie's

children while Katie was in the hospital in Kearney, NE for nine months. She was employed at Farmers' Home Administration from December 1955 until her retirement in 1981. After retirement, she worked for Gayle Hochstein Sand and Gravel as a bookkeeper. Sally supported two children from the Dominican Republic through Christian Charities from baby to 16 years of age.

Sally was an active member of the Holy Trinity Catholic Church, held a Perpetual Adoration Hour from January 1981 to 2013, CD of A, Holy Trinity Guild, life member of the Hartington VFW Post #5283 and life member of the Crofton American Legion Post 128. Sally served nine years on the Hartington Ambulance, she was a CCD Coordinator, and she served on the Community Caretakers and the Hartington Community Foundation. Sally also did volunteer work at the Hartington Nursing Center. In 1994, she was presented the Hartington Outstanding Citizen Award. She was a world traveler; she loved bowling and golf, and watching her neighbor kids grow up. Sally lived life to the fullest.

Sally is survived by fourteen nieces and nephews, Ann Marie Kuehler, Nancy Schieffer, Kathy Wicht, Pat Huss, Toni King, Steve Keiser, Jean Rief, Heidi Haberman, Rose Ann Sundin, Sharlene Guenther, Roman Bart, Don Keiser, Edward Bart, and Mary Ann Promes. Sister-in-law Irene Bart, and many great nieces and nephews.
