WIC Program Announces New Income Guidelines

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Health has released new income guidelines for the WIC Program effective April 1, 2014.

WIC is a special supplemental nutrition program, funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, provided at no cost to eligible moms, babies and children. Its goal is to help improve health by providing nutritious foods to supplement diets, offering education on healthy eating, nutrition and breastfeeding, and making referrals to other services.

If your family income does not exceed the following amounts for the size of your family, you could qualify for

WIC (listed as family size/185 percent of federal poverty level): 1 — \$21,590; 2 — \$29,101; 3 — \$36,612; 4 — \$44,123; 5 — \$51,634; 6 — \$59,145; 7 — \$66,656; 8 — \$74,167; 9 — \$81,678; 10 —

\$89,189 To find out if you or your children are eligible for the WIC Program, call for an appointment at your local WIC Office/Community Health Services Office. Offices can be found under the county listings in your phone book or on the web at http://doh.sd.gov/local-of-

fices/community-health-wic/. At the appointment you will be asked to provide family

residency and identity, and information about past and current health. You will also be required to measure your height and weight, take a finger stick blood test and visit with a health professional about nutrition education and health needs. Infants up to 9 months of age will not be required to take a blood test. If eligible, you will get food 'checks" to buy foods at authorized grocery stores.

Oglethorpe, GA, and administration school was in Conway, AR. On September 1, 1943, the WAAC was renamed the Women's Army Corp. From April 9, 1944 to October 20, 1945, Sally served her country in E.T.O. European Theatre of Operations) in England and France during WWII. It was during that period while working in the mailroom that she realized her brother, Raymond Bart was killed in action. On November 6, 1945, she was discharged at Ft. Sheridan, IL, having completed her tour of duty.

After returning to civilian life, Sally was employed at BF Goodrich in Chicago, as well as other places until 1950 when she returned to Nebraska. She worked at the Ford Garage in Hartington as a bookkeeper for four years. During this time she also cared for her sister, Katie's
