

"It's not been an arrow going straight up but it has been trending upward," he said. "When you look at younger farmers and their style of living compared to their parents' generation, they're definitely spending a lot more on family living than their parents did who lived through the '80s. It might take a year or two of being tight to scare them to quit spending, but typically you don't see that number go down from one year to the next, so that could be a little bit concerning in the

As for this year's outlook, Hofer said there is still plenty of profit to be made, but emphasized the need for efficient farming.

"Farmers are going to need to be more efficient than they have in the past because the margins aren't as good as they have been," he said. "However, prices have strengthened in the past three or four months so it looks like there's still going to be some money to be made in grain farming. Livestock is definitely going to be profitable this year, baring anything unforeseen. Overall it should be a good year."

Mitzel's tree tribute took on a different approach than many entries, Stoebner said.

"His essay was so heart-felt, and it really described how a tree would feel and what it would say if it could speak," she said. Those same feelings were

shared by Peg Haenfler, the Bon Homme Conservation District manager who judged the 91 essays from around the county. She forwarded the local winner to the state level.

Mitzel's essay captured a

great deal of imagination and emotion, Haenfler said. Garrett is telling a story as if he experienced it or described what the trees were feeling themselves," she said. "If you take (the message) right, you can relate the tree's story to having a child. It's as if you're watching kids take these steps, even though it's

Haenfler was overjoyed to receive the news of Mitzel's winning essay at the state

Stoebner teaches her students about Nebraska newspaper publisher J. Sterling Morton, who proposed the first Arbor Day in 1872. On that first Arbor Day, more than 1 million trees were planted in Nebraska.

"I ask the kids to imagine what this area looked like when the settlers first arrived and there were no trees except along the (Missouri) river," she said. "Someone had to plant all these trees." Mitzel's essay reinforces
