Third At State

T&F: USD's Eichkorn, Snyder Record League Weekly Honors

ELMHURST, Ill. —South Dakota junior Amber Eichkorn and senior Cody Snyder have been named Summit League Outdoor Track and Field Athletes of the Week for the period ended March 29, as released by the league office on Tuesday.

Eichkorn earns her first career Athlete of the Week honor for track and field after becoming the second Coyote in school history to win at the prestigious Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. The junior knocked more than a half-minute off her school record when she crossed the finish line in 16 minutes, 18.95 seconds. Eichkorn's time topped the national performance list at the time of her finish. She currently ranks eighth in the nation and first in the Summit League.

Snyder collects his fourth Athlete of the Week award in his career and the first of the outdoor season. The senior broke his own school record in the discus by throwing 194-6, eclipsing his

previous best by six feet. The throw earned him first place at the Bobcat Invitational and ranks fifth in the nation this season. Snyder also collected a seventh-place finish in the discus and 14th place in the shot put at the Texas Relays.

South Dakota competes at The Duels in Sioux Falls at 11 a.m. Saturday.

Minogue earns her first career Player of the Week award by leading South Dakota to a series win over IUPUI. The Corona, Calif., native hit .417 (5-for-12) and slugged .667 in the three-game series. In game two, Minogue was 3-for-5 with a home run, two RBIs and two runs scored. Her batting average of .429 ranks fourth-best in the Summit League this season. Minogue's 17 doubles in 29 games this season ranks second in the nation.

Minogue and the Coyotes (10-18-1, 2-1) play a three-game series against North Dakota State starting Friday in Fargo, N.D.

Crofton Girls Lead U.S. Cellular Cup Standings

LINCOLN, Neb. — The Crofton girls hold a slight lead on Kearney Catholic in the girls' standings of the U.S. Cellular cup, sponsored by the Nebraska School Activities Association.

Crofton holds a 220-215 lead on Kearney Catholic in the Class C girls' division. Wynot ranks fifth in the Class D girls' rankings, with Wausa tied for seventh. The Creighton boys are tied for seventh in Class C.

Crofton is third in the all-school division with 320 points, trailing Columbus Scotus (367.5) and Kearney Catholic (332.5). Wausa is tied for ninth in the Class D all-school division.

Summit League Posts Nation's Highest Women's Basketball Tournament Attendance Figure

ELMHURST, Ill. - The Summit League owns the highest session attendance mark of any NCAA Division I postseason conference this season while figures for the championship game and the entire tournament average outpaced all but one conference. Three of the league's crowds ranked among the nation's top nine session draws.

The Summit League record March 7 quarter-final crowd of 8,171 is higher than any session reported across Division I women's basketball. Among league championship games, The Summit League's 6,926 was the second-highest figure, outpacing all "big five" conferences (ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC). Additionally, The Summit League's semifinal drew 6,704 spectators, placing it as the third-best nationally in that category. In total, three Summit League sessions (quarterfinal I, semifinal and championship) ranked among the nation's top nine crowds.

Overall, The Summit League average attendance of 6,099 ranked second nationally and

outpaced each of the "big five" conferences by over 1,000 fans per session.

The Summit League will serve as host for the 2016 NCAA Women's Regional at the Denny Sanford PREMIER Center next March.

The girls' game will begin at 1 p.m., with the boys' game set for 3 p.m. Both games will air live on Midco Sports Network.

Hastings Women's Coach Lands Job At UN-Kearney

KEARNEY, Neb. (AP) — Nebraska-Kearney has hired Carrie Hofstetter as its head women's basketball coach.

The university announced Tuesday that the former Hastings College coach would be introduced at a news conference on campus Wednesday.

Hofstetter is a native of Edgar, Nebraska, and a graduate of Sandy Creek High School and Hastings College. She had a record of 68-31 the last three seasons at Hastings. The Broncos reached the NAIA Division II national quarterfinals in 2014 and the semifinals this season.

Hofstetter previously was top assistant at Hastings and Fort Hays State.

As a player, Hofstetter was a point guard who helped lead Hastings to national titles in 2002 and 2003.

She replaces Kevin Chaney, who led the program for five years.

Trials Set For Men Accused Of Cheating At Fish Tournament

CLEAR LAKE, Iowa (AP) — Trials have been scheduled for two northern Iowa men accused of cheating at a state-sponsored fishing tournament.

The Mason City Globe Gazette reports that 25-year-old Jason Schuttler, of Manly, and 23-year-old Aaron Lauber, of Clear Lake, have pleaded not guilty to one count each of felony theft. The accused were charged during the Yellow Bass Bonanza fishing tournament on Clear Lake on Feb. 8. They won a prize package valued at \$1,500.

The Iowa Natural Resources Department later received a tip that each of the fish were caught outside of the tournament's hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Schuttler's trial is set for June 9. Lauber's is scheduled

for June 23.

Chris Mullin Returns Home To Coach St. John's

NEW YORK (AP) — Chris Mullin is coming home to St. John's.

The Red Storm announced Tuesday that his career scoring leader and the player who led them to the 1985 Final Four is returning as coach.

He succeeds Steve Lavin, who agreed to leave last week. Lavin took the Red Storm to the NCAA Tournament twice in five seasons.

Mullin has not coached at any level, but says in a statement this is "a role I have been preparing for all of my life." He adds that he wants to influence players and help them reach their goals as coach Lou Carnesecca did for him 30 years ago.

Mullin, a New York native, was a five-time NBA All-Star with Golden State. He played on the 1992 Olympic Dream Team and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2011.

Iowa State assistant Matt Abdelmassih will join him as an assistant at St. John's.

Cubs Will Track Noise So Wrigley Rehab Doesn't Disturb Fans

CHICAGO (AP) — The Chicago Cubs are promising to monitor dust and noise to ensure Wrigley Field renovation work doesn't spoil games for fans or players.

Vice President of Ballpark Operations Carl Rice updated reporters Tuesday on the \$575 million, multi-year project to renovate the 101-year-old stadium.

He says the huge video board in left field will be operational by opening night Sunday. The ivy-covered outfield wall has been re-assembled, and restored statues of Ernie Banks and Ron Santo also will be back by Sunday.

Crews remain on track to open the expanded bleachers in left and center fields in May and the right field bleachers in June.

Work on an elevator will interfere with views from about 75 seats.

Other work continuing during baseball season includes construction of a new clubhouse.

Cubs Plan Opening Night Ernie Banks Tribute

CHICAGO (AP) — The Chicago Cubs and thousands of fans will honor the late Ernie Banks during the team's season opener against the St. Louis Cardinals this weekend.

The Hall of Famer known as "Mr. Cub" died in January at the age of 83.

A pregame ceremony and moment of silence are planned along with other tributes throughout Sunday night's game at Wrigley Field.

Banks' sons, Joey and Jerry, will throw out the ceremonial first pitches and lead the 7th inning stretch.

The Cubs said in a news release Tuesday that the team will wear No. 14 patches on their home and away jerseys all season.

Fans at Sunday's game will receive commemorative No. 14 pins.
