New Jersey Sen. Bob Menendez Indicted On Corruption Charges

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Bob Menendez was indicted on corruption charges Wednesday, accused of using his office to improperly benefit a Florida eye doctor and political donor.

The indictment charged the New Jersey Democrat with 14 counts, including bribery and conspiracy, over his ties to Dr. Salomon Melgen, a wealthy doctor and the politician's longtime friend.

Melgen also was charged in the case.

The indictment from a grand jury in New Jersey was the latest development in a federal investigation that came into public view when

federal authorities raided Melgen's medical offices two years ago. The investigation focused on whether the senator had improperly advocated on Melgen's behalf, including by intervening in a Medicare billing dispute.

Menendez has acknowledged that he flew multiple times on Melgen's private jet to the Dominican Republic and initially failed to properly pay for the trips. Menendez in 2013 agreed to reimburse Melgen \$58,500 for the full cost of two flights.

The lawmaker has said he did nothing wrong and that he and Melgen have been friends for decades.

South Dakota School of Mines and Technology President Heather Wilson said the school has conducted research into drones for years. Other South Dakota universities have expressed interest in the technology.

REBRAND

The Regents approved a proposal to rebrand a satellite center in Rapid City as a campus of Black Hills State University. The institution is currently known as University Center-Rapid City and is a partnership among South Dakota's six public universities.

Black Hills State University President Tom Jackson said rebranding the center as Black Hills State University-Rapid City will help it compete with other higher education institutions in Rapid City such as the city's technical institute.

Jackson said the approval "makes us the major player in Rapid City."

outstripped regulations. He said that unmanned aerial vehicles have the potential to be both a nuisance and an asset.

The new Regents policy establishes administrative requirements for universities that want to use drones and imposes limitations on where and when private users can fly them. An operator would have to fly the drone during daylight and away from buildings, people and animals. The drone would also have to remain in the pilot's field of vision and wouldn't be allowed near sports stadiums.

"You don't buzz the buildings, you don't buzz the people and you don't buzz the cows," Shekleton said.

under a million dollars for the system and is roughly spread out around 2,200 student employees throughout the state, Warner said.

"So there is good news and bad news," he said. "The good news for students is they will work fewer hours in order to earn the amount of money that they have. The bad news is that some services that (colleges) provide in the working hours might be cut back."

Cassy Jerett, a junior at USD double majoring in psychology and criminal justice, said that cutting her hours will affect her education.

"I feel like I accomplish less because I work as a research assistant," she said. "I would like to do more and learn more — but it's really hard when you can't literally work hours. It's frustrating."

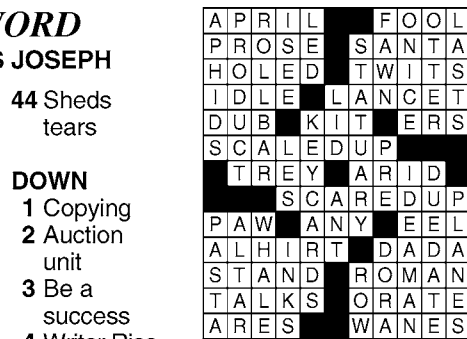

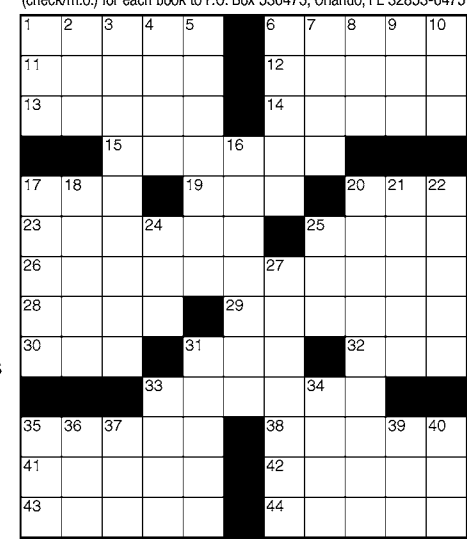
