## Brookings Sweeps Past Yankton

MMC Hands Northwestern First GPAC Loss Of Season

The Brookings Bobcats handed Yankton its first two setbacks of the 2015 season, beating the Bucks 2-1 in the opener and 4-2 in the nightcap at Bob Tereshinski Stadium at Riverside Field.

In the opening game, Brookings' Kyle Krogman pitched five no-hit innings to pick up the win. Jordan Kathol took the loss in relief of Colin Muth.

Mack Burns scored both Brookings runs, recording a hit for the Bobcats. Krogman, Jared Tschetter and Seth Fraser also had hits in the win.

Offensively for Yankton, Kathol had a hit and a run scored, and Brad Ulmer, Mason Townsend and Wyatt Adam also had hits. Austin Johnson drove in the lone Buck run.

In the nightcap, Tschetter had three hits, and Burns and Carter Mahlum each had two runs. Fraser doubled for the Bobcats.

For Yankton, Ulmer had a double and a RBI, and Muth had a double and a run scored to lead Yankton. Adam Walter had a hit and a RBI. Sheldon Gant, Townsend and Kathol also had hits. Tyler Guthmiller scored the other run.

Trevor Wallen picked up the win. Townsend took the loss.

Yankton, 1-2, travels to Brandon Valley on Tuesday.

# Pierre's Palmer Leads Class AA Girls' All-State Team

PIERRE — The tradition will continue.

Following names like Macy Miller, Kaitlyn Severyn, Chynna Stevens and Kerri Young, South Dakota State's women's basketball team will welcome another pair of homegrown All-State selections when Pierre T.F. Riggs' Sydney Palmer and Sioux Falls O'Gorman's Jessica Mieras matriculate to campus this fall.

First time first-team selections Palmer and Mieras were the top two vote-getters when the Class AA All-State team was released Thursday. Voting was done by the South Dakota Coaches As-

sociation and the South Dakota Sportswriters Association.

Palmer, who set multiple records in a five-year varsity run with the Lady Governors, was named the class' player of the year after averaging 19.1 points, 6.6 rebounds and 2.6 steals per game in leading Pierre (19-6) to its first state tournament appearance since 2009. She shot 43 percent from the field, including 37 percent from 3-point range.

Palmer's player of the year honor closes an end of season period in which she was named to the Eastern South Dakota all-conference first team, earned the AA Spirit of Su award at state and was named the state's Gatorade Player of the Year.

Palmer is also the Pierre's first three-time all-state selection.

"All the accolades she's gotten throughout the course of the last few weeks have been very well deserved," head coach Scott DeBoer said. "I think a lot of it is a testament to how she was able to lift her teammates and be a leader in ways outside of just those numbers.

"Obviously the number are impressive and that's what people can look at and point to; those are tangible things regarding her season and her career. But I think the reason we made a jump this year is because of her leadership and because of the things she does that are a little more intangible."

Mieras averaged 16.1 points, 6.7 rebounds and 1.6 blocks per game in helping guide O'Gorman (23-2) to its first championship game since 2011. Like Palmer, Mieras was named second-team as a junior.

"We're really excited about both Jess and Sydney," Johnston said. "Both have had great careers and been great community leaders and great people. I'm excited they're going to be joining us."

Mieras is joined on the first team by classmate Dalee Stene, who netted 12.1 points, dished out 7.4 assists and nabbed 2.6 steals per contest. It was Stene's second consecutive first-team selection.

# Yankton Wins 12 Events In Brookings Triangular

BROOKINGS – Throwers led the way for the Yankton track and field team in their final indoor event of the season, with senior Evan Greeneway and junior Adrienne Kusek each earning two titles in a triangular in Brookings on Thursday. The event was held at the Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex on the South Dakota State University campus.

Yankton won eight girls' events and four boys' events in the meet, which also featured athletes from Brookings and Harrisburg.

Kusek recorded a shot put toss of 37-6 and a discus throw of 102-2 to win both events. Josie Saylor also placed in both events for the Gazelles, finishing second in the shot put (31-8) and fifth in the discus (80-4).

Also for Yankton, Hanna Eide was third in the discus (86-6) and Aurora Papstein was fourth in the shot put (29-10.5).

Emma Stewart and Lindsey Hale

each earned top-five finishes in three individual events, including one victory. Stewart (32-11.5) and Hale (32-4) went 1-2 in the triple jump and 2-1 in the long jump, with Hale winning at 16-3 and Stewart placing second at 15-11.75. Stewart also tied for second in the high jump (4-8), while Hale was fifth in the 200 (5:28.12).

Also in the jumps, Emily Oswald tied for third in the triple jump (31-8) and tied for fourth in the high jump (4-6). Kate Budig also tied for fourth in the high jump. Lindsay Larson (8-0), Kaitlin Guthmiller (6-6) and Cassie Echols (6-6) went 3-4-5 in the pole vault.

Senior Danielle Beckmann won the 300 (44.48) and placed fourth in the 200 (28.00). Junior Savannah Woods claimed top honors in the 3200 (13:27.05). Sophomore Madason Tessier earned runner-up finishes in both the 60- (9.39) and 300-meter (50.43) hurdle events.

Also for the Gazelles, Danielle Salvatori placed fourth in the 60 hurdles (10.02) and fifth in the 300 hurdles (53.04). Tessa Folkers placed second in the 800 (2:42.58), Madison McClure finished second in the 1600 (5:28.71), Jaiden Boomsma placed third in the 60 (8.17) and Lauren Eidsness placed fifth in the 1600 (5:58.78).

Yankton finished 1-2 in the 3200 relay, finishing in 10:20.37 and 10:23.07. The Gazelles went 1-3 in the 400 relay, clocking times of 50.83 and 55.11.

Greeneway recorded tosses of 43-4.75 to win the shot put and 130-0 to win the discus. Teammate Nick Raab placed second in the shot (41-5.25) and third in the discus (118-6). Jordan Payer also placed in the discus, recording a fourth place mark of 117-10.

Ryan Sternhagen won the 300 (37.06) and placed second in the
