**WBB: Seekamp Repeats As Academic All-Summit League**

ELMHURST, Ill. — For the second-straight season, South Dakota senior Nicole Seekamp was named to the Summit League Women's Basketball Academic All-League team, as announced by the league office on Wednesday.

Seekamp claims her second Academic All-Summit League honor after helping the Coyotes to their first regular season Summit League title. She led the Summit League with 5.1 assists and 1.9 steals per game, while ranking fourth with 15.6 points per game during the season. Seekamp posted an average 23 points and five assists during the Summit League Tournament for MVP honors. A psychology major, Seekamp boasts a 3.67 grade point average.

The Renmark, South Australia, native left her mark in South Dakota basketball history when she moved into seventh all-time for career points (1,484), sixth in assists (396) and sixth in steals (176). Her career totals were accumulated over three seasons.

Also honored are South Dakota State's Megan Waytashok, Omaha's Mikaela Shaw, Fort Wayne's Haley Seibert and Western Illinois' Ashley Luke.

To be eligible for the Academic All-Summit League team, a student-athlete needed to have a minimum grade point average of 3.30, completed at least one full academic year at the institution and competed in at least 50 percent of their team's games.

**Bos Named To Men's Academic All-League Team**

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota senior guard Brandon Bos has been named to the Summit League Academic All-League Team for the second time in as many seasons.

Bos was selected to the five-man team in a vote by the faculty athletic representative and sports information directors of the league's nine member institutions. The student-athletes were chosen based on their academic and athletic performances this season.

This past season, Bos averaged 13.8 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game. He was the 13th-leading scorer and 11th-leading assist man in the Summit. He scored a career-high 29 points in a Summit League Tournament quarterfinal win against Fort Wayne, which was one of his six 20-point performances throughout his senior season.

Also honored were North Dakota State's A.J. Jacobson and Chris Kading, South Dakota State's Cody Larson and IUPUI's Knufu Najee.

To be eligible for the Academic All-League Team, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.30 (on a 4.0 scale), completed at least one full academic year at the current institution and participated in 50 percent of their team's competitions.

**South Dakota Collects 13,485 Pounds of Food In Food Fight**

VERMILLION, S.D. — A total of 13,485 pounds of food was donated to the Vermillion Food Pantry by South Dakota's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) as a part of the annual Summit League Food Fight.

SAAC completed in a league-wide initiative to collect canned food items and cash donations over the course of two separate weeks for local area food banks.

Coyote fans donated both canned goods and cash at home games and the Vermillion HiVee during two weeks in January. Area businesses also held watch parties or community events to help the cause. Jolley Elementary fifth grade classes collected over 2,100 items in a week to help boost the canned food donations. All donations went directly to the Vermillion Food Pantry.

Total food donations weighed in at over 2,800 pounds. Cash donations accounted for the remaining 10,600 pounds of food, with cash donations tabulated as \$5 being equivalent to 13 pounds of food.

South Dakota's total of 13,485 pounds, a 3,572-pound increase from a year ago, placed second in the annual competition. In the program's seven years, over 357,000 pounds of food have been collected for Summit League communities and their local food banks.

**Biagi, Prosser Added To USD Football Staff**

VERMILLION - University of South Dakota Head Football Coach Joe Glenn has added Marty Biagi and South Dakota alum Collin Prosser to his coaching staff. Biagi will coach cornerbacks. Prosser will coach tight ends and offensive tackles.

Biagi has spent the past three seasons at Southern University in Baton Rouge, La. Last year, he served as special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach, and the Jaguars were the top-ranked special teams unit in scoring in all of college football.

Southern returned four kickoffs for touchdowns, three punts for scores and Biagi was named a finalist for Football Scoop Special Teams Coordinator of the Year.

Biagi spent the 2011 season as co-defensive coordinator at the University of Arkansas-Pine Bluff. Prior to that, he was a graduate assistant at the University of Arkansas where he specialized

in coaching special teams and defensive backs. He also received commitments from eight players in six different states during his three years as a graduate assistant.

Biagi was a punter and placekicker for Marshall University from 2004-07. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in May of 2008.

Prosser has been an assistant coach at Morningside College since obtaining his master's degree from USD in December of 2010. The Mustangs, located in Sioux City, Iowa, are one of the premier NAIA programs in the country. Prosser has been a co-offensive coordinator and an offensive line and tight ends coach at Morningside in each of the last two seasons.

During his first two years, Prosser coached the Mustangs' running backs and was head coach of the JV team.

This past season, Morningside's offense generated 662 yards per game — more than any other college football team at any level. Prosser was twice named a finalist for Football Scoop Offensive Coordinator of the Year. He coached four All-Americans in four seasons in Sioux City.

Prosser served as a graduate assistant for the Coyotes during the 2009 and 2010 campaigns where he coached mainly tight ends. Prosser was also the team's video coordinator and had recruiting responsibilities in Western Nebraska and Southwest Minnesota.

Prosser graduated from Wayne State College in Nebraska with a degree in Health and Physical Education K-12 in 2009. He was a member of Wayne State's football team from 2004-08 and was named team captain prior to his senior season.

**Club VB Player Files Lawsuit Over Playing Time**

FAIRFAX, Va. (AP) — A 16-year-old club volleyball player and her family are suing after they say her coaches spiked her playing time, telling her she didn't have the skills to compete with her Virginia team, and her league blocked a transfer to another club.

Audrey Dimitrew and her family sued the Chesapeake Region Volleyball Association on March 10. The lawsuit, which seeks to let Audrey transfer teams and asks for attorney

fees, says that when Audrey accepted a spot on the under-16 Chantilly Juniors in November she was led to believe she would get playing time.

Coaches told her she had the potential to play college volleyball, the lawsuit says, and that she would get "significant tournament game experience" as one of two setters on the team.

But things changed after the season began, her attorney Robert J. Cunningham said,

and she was told she didn't have the skills to compete with the team. Audrey, a 10th grader at Woodgrove High School in Purcellville, Virginia, was told by her coaches that she could transfer to another club team in the league if she wanted, the lawsuit says. She thought she had scored when another team, NV Premier, wanted her, but the league cried foul and said no to a transfer. After several appeals to the league were denied the family filed suit.
