Wagner Schools Offering 'Make It Count Conference'

WAGNER — Nine area high schools will come together to attend the "Make It Count Conference" on Tuesday, April 7 in Wagner. The event will feature programming that will help high school juniors and seniors address their post-high educational and career needs.

The program features a variety of presentations by professions in a variety of areas that are geared to the different needs of the juniors and the seniors. The students will also have the opportunity to attend a college fair with more than 40 different colleges, technical schools and

the military.

A "Retention of Youth Career Fair" will also be held and will feature more than 25 different career areas and will focus on providing the students with information about those careers and will encourage students to consider returning to rural South Dakota after their training.

The program is being held at the Wagner High School in Wagner and begins at 12:45 p.m. and ends at 3:15 p.m. The

high schools who have stated they will be attending are: Avon, Armour, Platte-Geddes, Andes Central, Marty Indian School, South Central, Tripp/Delmont, Niobrara and Wagner. More than 300 students are expected to participate in this special program.

A drawing for two scholarships will also be held, with support from businesses from five different communities.
