"It was just the matter of only a couple plays that made the difference," Minogue said. "Coaches harped on us that it could be the other way around next time." With 19 games remaining in the regular season, the Coyotes have to play a home game – their schedule is back-loaded with games in Vermillion. On Wednesday, USD plays a doubleheader at Creighton, but returns home for a weekend series against Fort Wayne. To this point in the season, the Coyotes have been trying to put everything together, said Klyse, whose teams ranks fourth in the Summit League in batting average (.280) and sixth in earned run average (5.59).

"I think what we're trying to do is focus on what works for us," Klyse said. "Just recently, it seems like we've figured that out." Minogue is front and center in those efforts.

The native of Corona, California, ranks fourth in the conference in hitting (.430) and is on pace to double her offensive output from a year ago in league games (.212). The biggest improvement for the first baseman? Her mental strength, Klyse said. "Last year, she created a target on her back, but once it got to conference, people knew how to pitch her," the coach said. "She let them get the best of her."

Minogue was moved up to the leadoff spot in the batting order this season and she's responded with the nation's second-most doubles (18) – which has allowed teammates to be successful.

"I feel like I've always been confident at the plate," she said. "When I go up there, I have the mindset that I'm going to hit the ball hard."

As far as the doubles are concerned, Minogue joked that she isn't exactly able to pinpoint why they've come in bunches. "If I can get into scoring position, that's great," she said. "Honestly, I don't think I've changed much. I'm just seeing the ball better, I guess."
