# **Greek Minister: Evidence For Massive German War Reparations**

ATHENS, Greece (AP) -Greece's defense minister said his country's government has obtained "stunning evidence" to support its claim that German World War II reparations are worth a massive 278.7 billion euros (\$302 billion).

Panos Kammenos said Greece had obtained records held by the U.S. military that review the extent of damage to private and public property during the Nazi occupation.

"There is stunning evidence — detailing what (happened) in every village and in every town," Kammenos said in remarks made at the ministry Monday and published Tuesday.

"The evidence is so compelling that it will lead to the reopening of cases, even those that have already gone to court.

### **BACK TO SCHOOL**

On Tuesday, students at Viborg-Hurley returned to classes after the Easter break, and administrators and teacher were forced to deal with questions they did not know the answers to.

In an interview with television station KELO, superintendent Rob Sylliaasen said the district returned to classes as normal, but the mood in the school was not normal.

"It has been a sad day for our school district as we are grieving with the family at this time," he said. "We are trying to hold on to hope and provide support to our students and staff. We make our counselors available and we can reach out to our surrounding districts and bring counselors II we need to."

The spat over reparations is likely to add to tensions between the two countries over Greece's troubled bailout repayments. The two-month-old government in Athens is struggling to repay debts and draw up a convincing costcutting reforms plan that Germany and other creditors want before they pay more rescue loans. Nazi Germany led the

three-year wartime occupation of Greece that saw tens of thousands of people die of starvation under a brutal regime that carried out random executions in response to resistance fighters and destroyed vital infrastructure during its retreat.

On Sunday, Deputy Finance Minister Dimitris Mardas told a parliament committee that private and state reparation claims from Greece were worth a staggering 278.7 billion euros (\$302 billion). Germany says it has al-

ready settled its reparations to Greece in post-war agreements. Sigmar Gabriel, Germanv's economy minister, argued

that Greece's new left-led gov ernment was attempting to use the reparations issue to influence debt negotiations.

"To be honest I think it's dumb," Gabriel said. "I think that it doesn't move us forward one millimeter on the question of stabilizing Ĝreece."

South Dakota, Michels said. The reforms will cost an estimated \$3.5 million, compared to the \$30 million otherwise needed to build additional juvenile facilities, he added.

"In one circuit, 65 percent of the kids sent away (to juvenile facilities) came from one judge," Michels said. "Why? Because there was no system (offering alternatives).

That particular example wasn't the only instance where judges held few options, the lieutenant governor said. He pointed to the impact of sending young offenders far from familiar surroundings.

"In the past, a kid may use marijuana. If they're in the juvenile system, we could send them to (STAR Academy at) Custer," he said. "But Yankton to Custer is a long distance from home and you don't know any-

body. As a result, juvenile offenders find themselves without the support of family and friends, Michels said. In addition, juvenile offenders may not acquire the skills for successfully returning to their hometowns, he said.

In his State of the State address last January, Daugaard noted such incarceration may not be necessary in many cases.

South Dakota's juvenile violent crime arrest rate is one-third the national average, the governor said. In 2013, seven of every 10 youth committed to the DOC were for misdemeanor offenses, probation violations and status offenses like underage drinking or truancy.

"For most juveniles, com-

mitment to the Department of Corrections means some kind of out-of-home placement, not for all of them but for most of them — some kind of out-of-home placement. That's an expensive thing," the governor said.

During Tuesday's Rotary Club meeting, Michels said the new reforms will address a number of those issues. Juvenile offenders who qualify for the program will receive help with family, counseling and substance abuse issues without needing incarceration.

Just locking up juveniles and not offering treatment programs isn't the answer, Michels said.

"The vast majority (of juvenile offenders) have chemical dependency issues, and we aren't offering diversion therapy," he said. "Is it right for them to go back (home) without the tools?'

We want to provide support for kids but hold them accountable," he added.

A community response team will include individuals from the court system, court services, the Department of Corrections and community health centers, Michels told the Press & Dakotan.

"We have the presump-tion of probation," he said. 'The team will look at the crime, the social environment and the tools that are available. They will do an evaluation, and there will be a response."

Michels sees a number of common factors for any successful treatment. "They need a way to stay clean, find work, be trained and receive counseling," he said.

Community service offers an option, Michels said. "This would use a citation process that would be used for petty offenses rather than have (the offenders) booked," he said.

cookie-cutter approach, recognizing the differences among various parts of the state, the lieutenant governor said. In addition, South Dakota officials have worked on jurisdictional cooperation for American Indian and out-

of-state juvenile offenders. Michels said he has received initial input and positive feedback on the juvenile justice reforms from Yankton area lawmakers, educators, youth workers, judges and court services personnel. He anticipates some final tweaking of the reforms in the coming months.

In his State of the State address, Daugaard noted the tremendous potential savings and outcomes with the reforms.

The work group recommendations, taken together, are projected to reduce the DOC population in residential treatment by more than 50 percent within five years and save millions of dollars, the governor said.

**On Tuesday, Michels told** the Press & Dakotan he holds similar high hopes for the reforms. He expects the first firm statistics will become available in two years.

"It'll be interesting to see the results," he said. "I think it'll be hugely successful."
