who have served overseas to all men and women who are willing to take that risk."

Ted Fowler, a Vietnam War veteran from Aberdeen who served in the U.S. Army, said he doesn't think the public understands the impact the change will have. He said his group wants to eventually refer the measure to the voters.

"There are 78,000 veterans in South Dakota and, if we get them all moving in the same direction, we can have an impact," he said.

The changes to the definition will go into effect on July 1.

NU Tuition Freeze Could Thaw Next Year

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — It appears the University of Nebraska's tuition freeze will melt next year.

The *Lincoln Journal Star* reports that a tuition increase was broached Friday at a University of Nebraska Board of Regents meeting.

Chris Kabourek, NU's director of budget and plan-

ning, told the board that a 3 percent increase in state aid proposed by the Legislature would allow the university to cover most of its ongoing expenses, but a modest tuition increase would be necessary to fully fund its operations.

The tuition freeze was part of a 2012 deal with the Nebraska Legislature. It pro-

vides a 4 percent increase in state appropriations in exchange for keeping tuition rates flat for Nebraska students.

But after taking office in January, Gov. Pete Ricketts proposed a lesser 3 percent increase.

"Before I was in the group, I lost my first 60 pounds," she said. "It was very slow going. I was running races, but I was still at 200 pounds when I was running those. I got to sub two-hundred and I have maintained sub-200 for eight years."

Thomas said that when she started Rita's Biggest Losers, she was at 188 pounds.

"At the time, my family said that I looked great — compared to the fact that I was 250 pounds most of my life," she said.

Colleen Vornhagen also decided to join the group to fulfill her New Year's resolution to get healthy.

"I wanted to get into a healthier lifestyle," Vornhagen said. "I have always been very active. It seems like for the last year or so I became a little less active. I started drinking pop and have a couple a day, and I noticed a little weight creeping on. I never weighed that much in my life. I wanted to get my energy back and get healthy."

To join the challenge, each participant put in \$100. The top two losing the most body fat percentage in the group would get a cash prize at the end of the event.

For inspiration, each week Houska posted on a closed Facebook group the top six members after the participants weighed in at the store.

"I remember I was in fifth place, and I thought to myself, 'I better up my game.' Because I knew that's what I had to do if I wanted to win," Thomas said. "Competition was it for me."

Houska said that the

money pot really motivated the participants in her challenge.

"I think money talks to a lot of people," she said.

Though the cash prize gave participants the drive, Thomas and Vornhagen both agreed that Houska and the Rita's Biggest Losers Facebook group gave them the support they needed to accomplish their goals.

"We would give motivational messages to each other on Facebook and that was nice," Vornhagen said. "Rita is so kind and motivated herself. She has donated a lot of her time in trying to set this up and it just has been a good group."

Houska said she would post on the groups page frequently to see how everyone was doing with the challenge throughout the week.

The group kept her updated with their process — well, most of the time.

"I remember we were probably three-fourths of the way done with the challenge and I posted to ask to see how everyone was doing," Houska said. "But no one answered me. So I said, OK, I'm done."

Thomas said the group felt horrible.

"I told her no one replied because we all had a bad weekend," she laughed. "The hardest part is always being honest with yourself about what you weigh. It's also about being honest when you make mistakes."

But all the hard work paid off.

Vornhagen lost 33 pounds and 17.66 percent of her body fat, earning her a first place title and an extra \$1,300 in her pocket.

"I just feel that I have been blessed with a healthy body now," she said.

Thomas took second place in the competition.

"No one has ever seen me this small," she said.
