First Dakota National Bank Purchases Home Federal Bank's Pierre Branch

An agreement has been reached for First Dakota National Bank to purchase Home Federal Bank's Pierre branch, it was announced Wednesday. The agreement is subject to regulatory approval, according to a press release issued Wednesday. "We look forward to serving the Pierre community," remarked Larry F. Ness, Chairman and CEO of First Dakota National Bank. "Pierre is a good, strong community with hard-working and talented people. We are confident we can play a role in their future success and we can't wait to get there."

"This branch sale is part of our ongoing strategy to become focused on our core banking markets in eastern South Dakota, which will improve our efficiency and align our business model with our market opportunities," said Stephen M. Bianchi, HF Financial Corp.'s president and Chief Executive Officer. "We believe our strategy will benefit both customers and shareholders, and we are confident that First Dakota National Bank will provide our Pierre branch customers with excellent service and contribute positively to the Pierre community." The application to purchase is being filed with the respective regulators.

Once approved, the conversion will occur. The conversion is expected to close in approximately 90 days. First Dakota has more than \$1 billion in total assets and 16 banking branches in 12 communities throughout southeast South Dakota. Home Federal's Pierre branch has \$25 million in total assets. Ness stated, "We believe it's our responsibility to make strong contributions to the communities we serve, and we plan to utilize both current and additional staff to expand upon the contributions Home Federal has made in the community over the past many years."
