WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed broadly lower Friday. Investors were worried that Greece may default on its debt and exit the euro currency block. Chinese regulators were also taking steps Friday to rein in a runaway stock market there.  
The Dow Jones industrial average fell 279.47 points, or 1.5 percent, to 17,826.30.  
The Standard & Poor's 500 index lost 23.81 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,081.18.  
The Nasdaq composite fell 75.98 points, or 1.5 percent, to 4,931.81.

Wheat for July delivery fell 1.50 cents to \$4.8925 a bushel; July corn was up 3.50 cents to 3.8675 a bushel; July oats rose 5.50 cents to 2.69 a bushel; while July soybeans gained 2.50 cents to \$9.7150 a bushel.  
Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle fell 3 cents to \$1.49 a pound; August feeder cattle was off 4.47 cents to \$2.1020 a pound; while June lean hogs were .10 cent lower at \$.7627 a pound.

State Historical Records Advisory Board Announces Re-Grant Opportunity

PIERRE — The South Dakota State Historical Records Advisory Board (SD SHRAB) is accepting re-grant applications from records caretakers across the state.  
The funding comes through a grant from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) of the National Archives and Records Administration.  
“With the grant money, the board will be able to disseminate \$4,000 in funds to local repositories, organizations, and historical societies to encourage and support identification and preservation of historical records, as well as training for staffers who care for those records,” said Chelle Somsen, SD SHRAB chair and state archivist for the South Dakota State Historical Society at the Cultural Heritage Center in Pierre.  
The deadline for application submission is April 30.  
The SD SHRAB advocates preservation of historical records, educates the public and records caretakers about the importance of historical records, and leads the historical community in preserving, promoting, and providing access to the state's documentary heritage, Somsen said.  
The purpose of the re-grant program is to address priorities identified in the SD SHRAB strategic plan. Priorities identified include:  
• Increased access to archival collections  
• Increased opportunities for education, training, and development in archives and collection management  
• Identification of important historical records that are at risk; and  
• Increased funding for South Dakota's historical records
