Notice is given that the City of North Sioux City, c/o Don Fuxa, Mayor, 504 River Drive, North Sioux City SD 57049 has filed an application for a water permit to appropriate 1.34 cubic feet of water per second [cfs] (905 acre-feet annually) from two wells completed into the Dakota Formation Aquifer (262 and 294 feet deep) located in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 4-T89N-R48W for municipal use. Water Right No. 6285-3 appropriates 0.89 cfs at a volume of 386 acre-feet annually from one well located in the same area as described above. Water Right No. 6285-3 and this application, if approved, will allow alternate pumping of the three wells at a peak diversion rate of 2.22 cfs for a combined total of 1,291 acre-foot of water annually.

They agreed by consensus that a reference to WPATH standards of care should be removed because, in the opinion of various people, the organization promotes transgender as a choice.

That is the acronym for World Professional Association for Transgender Health.

Several directors also suggested they revisit the SDHSAA policy's requirement that an athlete could change her or his gender identity only once during the athlete's high school eligibility.

That part of the policy is intended to force the athlete and family members to reach a binding decision before seeking the change in gender identity in order to compete as a member of the opposite sex.

The coming survey will ask school officials to consult with their school district's legal counsel regarding whether the transgender policy would be better to continue as a state-wide policy, or be made the responsibility of each school system to decide.

If the directors decide at the June meeting to formally consider changes, the final decision would come at the August meeting. The date of that meeting hasn't been officially set yet. Director Jason Uttermark of Aberdeen said the SDHSAA

USDA Starts On Potential Vaccine

MINNEAPOLIS — The U.S. Department of Agriculture is working on a vaccine to counter a deadly strain of bird flu, as losses to poultry producers mount.

A pure "seed strain" would target the H5N2 virus — which has already cost Midwest turkey and chicken producers over 7 million birds since early March — as well as some other highly pathogenic viruses in the H5 family that have been detected in other parts of North America. If the USDA decides the vaccine is necessary to stop avian influenza, it will provide that seed strain to drug manufacturers.

The process, though, is fraught with questions about which birds would get the vaccine, how it might affect exports and whether it would be effective against the rapidly spreading strain.

board needs to hear from leaders of the Associated School Boards of South Dakota and the school administrators organization as part of the review process.

"They sure have that prerogative. We have to abide by that," Uttermark said.

The WPATH standards of care were a common item of complaint by people who spoke to the directors Tuesday. Director Dan Whalen of Pierre said Wednesday the WPATH reference was a reason he voted last year against adopting the policy.

Director Steve Morford of Spearfish said the board has three choices ahead: Keep the current policy, scrap it altogether or amend it.

"I think we've discussed that enough today. We're going to tweak it," Morford said.
