

to fail," Smith said. "We kind of rejuvenated it."

Double S Bull Co., which is sanctioned with the BOA, now advertises across the country for its tour.

Last year, Yankton saw competitors from eight states for its event, Smith said.

'(They came) from as far away as Texas and Oklahoma to as close as everywhere in between," he said. "What's different from rodeo compared to lots of other sports is, the competitors have to pay an entrance free. Some of these guys drive from Texas just to get there and then they pay their entry fee on top of that.

On top of the prize money from the entry, the Yankton committee adds \$5,000 to the cash prizes, which Smith called "really a good purse,"

"If the competitors ride a bull, they will get a check," he said.

Between the cash prizes and Double S's award-winning bulls, the Yankton competition is an attractive event, Smith said.

He added that not all bulls are the same.

"There are people out there that think you can train a bull to buck, and that's just 100 percent wrong," he said. "Bulls want to buck or they don't want to buck. A lot of bulls that we're hauling have 30-40 years of breeding behind them for just bucking. It's just genetics. If they don't do their job and don't want to buck, they have no place in the rodeo. That's why we are one of the best.

Smith said that cowboys across the nation follow Double S Bull to compete in the tournaments.

'With the cowbovs that follow us and our bulls, we put on a better show than the rest can do," he said.

Gov. Dennis Daugaard signed the legislation, SB 1, into law on March 30. Most of the provisions in the measure including the 80 mph change took effect April 1.

The current 55 mph zone on Highway 273, starting at the I-90 junction for Kennebec, would be reduced to 35 mph for about one mile. A 45 mph limit would be set for the next two-tenths of a mile.


