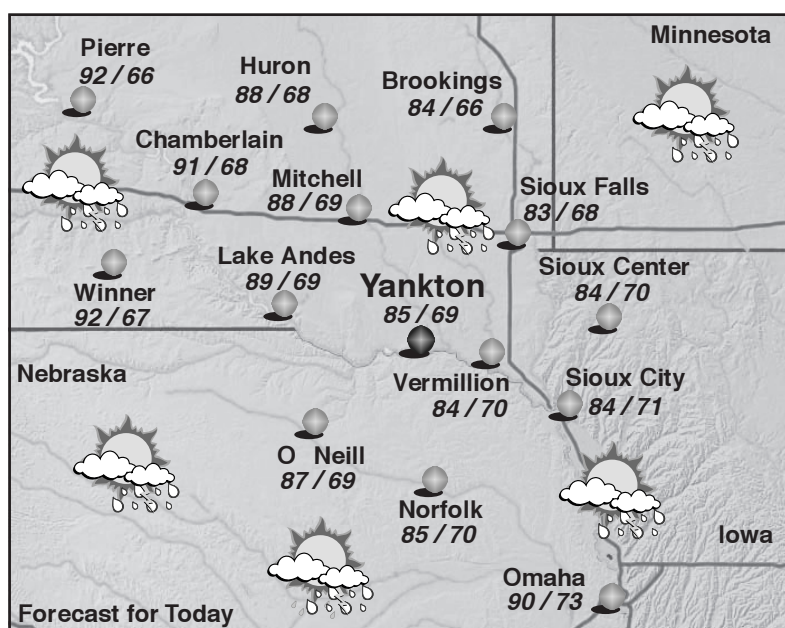

 Pickets at the Morrell packing plant where union workmen are on strike blocked a march of 35 non-union workers early today and turned them back from their jobs despite a warning from city officials against any intimidation or violence.
 Rotland Freisler, state secretary for the German ministry of justice, disclosed today that activity against the Nazi Party and its organizations will be regarded as treason against the people and will be punished by death under the new criminal code.

Tuesday, Aug. 2, 1960
 There were 204 revenue passengers leaving Yankton on North Central Airlines during July, bringing the total number of passengers for the year ending Aug. 30 to 1,978, 178 more than the 1,800 minimum required to justify continuation of regular airline service here, with another month still to go.
 The federal government has allotted \$14,419 for airport development at Springfield during the coming year. The money will be used to acquire land and for clearing zone

erasements, the office of senators Karl Mundt and Francis Case were notified.

 Farmers will have to wait at least until September to find out what their government subsidies will look like for the next four years.
