 • The mercury topped the 100-degree mark for the first time this summer Tuesday afternoon, being recorded at 101 degrees at the Yankton State Hospital.

Since a year ago, several hundred tons of heavy rock and gravel have been hauled in and it is working out into Lewis & Clark Lake in good shape.

## AG LINES

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for September delivery surged 31.75 cents to \$6.9325 a bushel, while September corn lost 2.25 cents to \$3.905 a bushel and oats for September delivery added 5.5 cents to \$2.765 a bushel. November soybeans rose 5 cents to \$10.10 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures traded lower and pork futures advanced on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle slipped 0.18 cent to 94.42 cents a pound; August feeder cattle fell 1.12 cents to \$1.126 a pound; October lean hogs gained 0.59 cent to 79.6 cents a pound; and August pork bellies climbed 3 cents to \$1.065 a pound.
