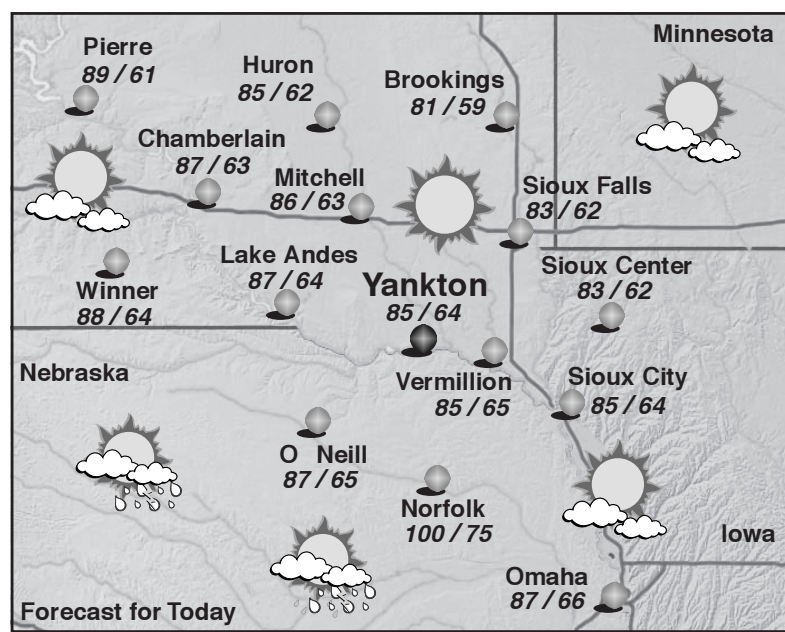

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures advanced Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Wheat for September delivery soared 45.75 cents to \$7.2575 a bushel, while September corn jumped 10.75 cents to \$4.0025 a bushel and oats for September delivery climbed 5.25 cents to \$2.8025 a bushel. November soy-

beans rose 6.25 cents to \$10.2425 a bushel.
 Meanwhile, beef and pork futures also traded higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 October live cattle added 1.55 cents to 95.77 cents a pound; August feeder cattle edged up 0.6 cent to \$1.136 a pound; October lean hogs inched 0.03 cent higher to 78.95 cents a pound; and August pork bellies gained 4.5 cents to \$1.14 a pound.

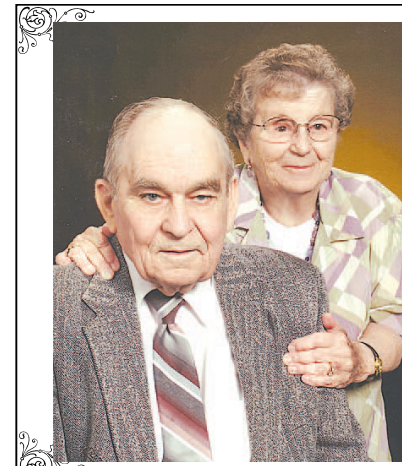
