**Repair Crews
Fix Valve At
Omaha Plant**

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Repair crews have stopped the flow of untreated wastewater into the Missouri River near Offutt Air Force Base.

The Omaha Public Works Department says a valve at the city's Papillion Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant was fixed about 7:30 p.m. Friday. It has failed earlier Friday, letting untreated wastewater flow into the Missouri at the rate of 100 cubic feet per second.

The city has lifted its advisory against wading or swimming in the Missouri near Offutt, but it urges caution in the area because of high water and strong currents.

Wis. Man Dies In Motorcycle Crash

SALEM (AP) — A Wisconsin man has died after a motorcycle crash on Interstate 90 east of Salem, in eastern South Dakota.

The highway patrol identified him as 57-year-old Robert Lewis Jr. of Manawa, Wis.

The patrol says Lewis' motorcycle began to wobble after its rear tire went flat, and Lewis and his passenger, 60-year-old Judith Lewis, also of Manawa, Wis., were thrown.

Lewis died at a Sioux Falls hospital following the Saturday evening crash. Lewis suffered serious but non-life-threatening injuries.

The patrol says their motorcycle was hauling a two-wheeled camper at the time.

Neb. Lawmakers Return To State

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — The five members of Nebraska's congressional delegation will be back to the state during the August recess of Congress.

Republican U.S. Sen. Mike Johanns will begin a two-week tour of the state on Monday morning, starting in Omaha and heading to southeast Nebraska. He'll cover much of the state until heading back to Omaha on Aug. 19.

Democratic U.S. Sen. Ben Nelson also will be in Nebraska, making appearances in Omaha, Lincoln and Ashland.

Two of Nebraska's three GOP House members also have released public appearance schedules that cover the coming days.

Rep. Adrian Smith began making appearances Friday and will travel much of his 3rd District through next Friday. Rep. Jeff Fortenberry lists his first appearance Tuesday in South Sioux City.

Fuel Spilling Into Ravine Lake

HURON (AP) — Workers continue to search for the source of diesel fuel spilling into Ravine Lake in Beadle County.

County emergency management director Tom Moeding says absorbent booms are soaking up the fuel flowing from a storm sewer outlet into the lake.

The spill was reported Thursday afternoon by a woman who smelled the fuel while fishing.

Moeding says the fuel was tracked to the sewer outlet, but the source wasn't found. Workers from a private company are expected to search Monday for the source.

Man Burned In Bellevue Home Fire

BELLEVUE, Neb. (AP) — A man has suffered severe burns in a fire that destroyed a mobile home in Bellevue.

Fire officials have not released the name of the man hurt in Saturday's morning blaze. He was taken to a hospital in critical condition.

Bellevue fire department spokeswoman Jack Syphers says crews were able to keep the fire from spreading to other mobile homes. The fire is believed to have started in a bedroom.

Brandon Casino Robbed; No Arrests

BRANDON (AP) — Authorities are searching for a man who robbed Blinky's Casino in Brandon at gunpoint.

Brandon police say the man had a bandanna over his face and was armed with a silver-colored handgun when he entered the casino about 1:35 a.m. Saturday and demanded money from a female employee.

Police say he restrained the woman in a bathroom, then fled with an undisclosed amount of money.

The suspect is described as being about 5-feet-9 with a small build and "a distinctive walk." He's believed to be in his early twenties. He was last seen wearing blue jeans, a black T-shirt, white hooded sweat shirt and black gloves.

Macedonians Cook Up Beans Record

SKOPJE, Macedonia (AP) — A village in Macedonia has set a new record for the biggest amount of beans boiled in a pot, beating the previous total set by a group of students in South Dakota.

A spokeswoman for Guinness World Records told Macedonian television that the record of 3.15 tons was set Sunday in the eastern village of Sarchievo. The previous record was 1.35 tons.

The record was set at the Saint Friday festival, named for a local monastery, where participants traditionally boil beans. The pot used to boil the beans was 5-feet (1.5-meters) tall.

Tornadoes Hit N.D., Minnesota

GRAND FORKS, N.D. (AP) — As many as seven tornadoes may have touched down Saturday evening in southeast North Dakota and western Minnesota, the National Weather Service said Sunday. No injuries were reported in any of the tornadoes.

Weather service crews on Sunday surveyed damage from two of the twisters, including a strong one that hit near Tyler, N.D., about 7 p.m. Saturday. Meteorologist Greg Gust, in the weather service's Grand Forks office, said that tornado was on the ground for about five miles and had wind speeds greater than an EF3, which range from 136 to 165 mph.

"It was scouring a sugar beet field and pulling sugar beets out of the ground, so it had a bit of attitude," he said.

The tornado also destroyed seven farm buildings and tossed a pickup truck about a half mile into a field, Gust said.

Weather service crews also looked at damage from a tornado in Grant and Douglas counties in Minnesota, but Gust said that one caused little structural damage to buildings. It was on the ground for 19 miles and had wind speeds of 86 to 100 mph.

Additional assessments were planned for Monday as the weather service worked to confirm the exact number of tornadoes. Gust said the storms that started in North Dakota and moved east into Minnesota spawned at least four tornadoes and possibly up to seven. They caused some damage on farms.

A video shot by a storm chaser

showed a tornado touching down near a farm house in Wilkin County, Minn., and debris flying into the air as the funnel tore into the building.

The home destroyed in the video was near the tiny community of Campbell, Minn., according to a dispatcher with the Wilkin County sheriff. But the owner, Al Kosel, 76, and his family weren't home, and there were no injuries, she said.

Dave Langenwalter told KLVY-TV in Fargo that he and his son had just gone into their basement when a tornado touched down just yards from their house near Tyler. His garage was gone, he said, and his car was picked up and dropped several yards away. Langenwalter found it behind a nearby grove of trees.
