## Girlfriend

Harmonizing Trio  
Performs At Dakota  
Theatre During  
Riverboat Days

The Dakota Theatre in downtown Yankton is getting into the Riverboat Days spirit this year bringing a regional trio to perform on stage at 2 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 21. "We are excited about getting the group 'Girlfriend' here to be a part of the Riverboat Days activities," said Lewis and Clark Theatre Company executive director Chuck Lambert. "It is a perfect time. Go down to the river in the morning, enjoy the festivities in the park. Eat lunch, then come up to the theatre at 2 p.m. to enjoy a great show in our air-conditioned facilities. Once it is over, head back down to the park for more fun."

The group — made up of sisters Jill Miller and Barb Johnson along with Colene "Coco" Walters — takes pride in adding three-part harmony to hits from past decades.

"Our show will contain music from the '40s, '50s, '60s, '70s and '80s. We try to pick hits from all of the decades, as well as finish with original songs we have written ourselves," Miller said. "We enjoy taking songs that don't traditionally have harmonies and splitting them into three parts. We want to entertain people and have them leave singing and talking about what they just heard."

According to the group's website Girlfriend does a variety of music ranging from the Andrews Sisters' and McGuire Sisters' classics like "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" and "Sincerely," to old and new country and rock classics.

"We do a lot of research and try and find the popular hits and a variety of what people want to hear," Walters said. "We have even asked people what songs they would want to hear."

The Sioux City-based trio has deep Nashville roots that may make the singers seem familiar to you an audience that has not seen the group before.

"Coco performed for three years on the

## Wandering Wuestewald Stops By

Yankton Native  
Brings His  
Musical Journey  
Back To His  
Hometown  
During August

For Rosco Wuestewald, the last seven years have felt like a tour.

The 23-year-old musician and photographer, who jokes that he's "going on 80," said his "wanderlust" feet have taken him around the world since growing up in Yankton.

"I'm not one to stick around a place for more than six or seven months," Wuestewald said while taking a moment to reflect from the dock in front of Yankton's Ice House. "My feet just never want to slow down. They keep running away."

He said he's not sure yet what they're running away from, but that's not much of a concern right now. He's having a good time and has been to Hawaii, Minneapolis, Los Angeles, Chicago, Montana, Ireland, Turkey, Greece, Italy, Spain, Holland, England and other places since leaving home at 17. The only constant companion during all those adventures has been the bloody and beat-up Hohner guitar Wuestewald's parents gave him when he was 14.

After all those travels, Wuestewald is content to be in his hometown of Yankton for the month of August. "It feels really good to be home," he said. "I think this is the most excited I've been to be home in a long time."

During the course of visiting family and friends who

have provided support and inspiration since he was a child, Wuestewald will play a handful of shows locally.

He's excited about a concert planned for Thursday, Aug. 19, at Magilly's Lakeside Eatery, which is located at the Lewis and Clark Marina. The free all-ages show will begin between 7-8 p.m., Wuestewald said.

Among those playing will be Logan Marsh, Jake Dempsey and Nick Sorensen (of Top Shelf Stank), Oyster-Toe & Sadie Show, Dylan Smith, TC Steckelberg, Jake Kortan, Rebecca Swift, Tom Pearson and Matt Sand.

"I wanted to come to Yankton and put on an epic show with all these musicians around the area that I've known for years and years," he said. "It's definitely going to melt some faces. We've got some friends from out of town coming in to play."

"Come out early, have some drinks and hang out with us," Wuestewald added. "I think we're going to have more fun on stage than the people watching the show. I think the people watching are going to want to get on stage and dance around with us."

Wuestewald spent the last seven months in New York City working at a nightclub, where he met some of the world's biggest musical acts. He had planned on staying in the Big Apple for two days.
