## Two Arrested In Connection With RV Park Burglaries

Two men have been arrested in connection with April burglaries that resulted in damages and property loss valued at more than \$19,000.

According to the Yankton County Sheriff's Office, Michael James Darcy, 19, Yankton, was arrested on two counts of third-degree burglary. Michael Jonathan Martinez, 18, Yankton, was arrested on two counts of

aiding and abetting or advising.

Ten campers were burglarized April 10 in the Vacation Village RV Park along Highway 52. Damage was done to the campers, and the items stolen included television sets, stereos and liquor. The total estimated value of the damages and property loss is \$19,338.

The sheriff's office is continuing its investigation into the incident, and more arrests are expected.

**Grains Futures Advanced Thursday**  
On The Chicago Board Of Trade CHICAGO (AP) — Wheat for December delivery surged 18.75 cents to \$7.4375 a bushel, while December corn jumped 10.75 cents to \$4.2175 a bushel and oats for December delivery rose 3 cents to \$2.85 a bushel. November soybeans climbed 13 cents to \$10.285 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures fell and pork futures traded higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle slipped 0.05 cent to 95.3 cents a pound; October feeder cattle lost 0.95 cent to \$1.1227 a pound; October lean hogs gained 0.97 cent to 74.62 cents a pound; and August pork bellies added 4 cents to \$1.405 a pound.

race a few times.

Once Jacobson got the financing, he hired Brandon and Mike Kruger to design the track, and Jacobson said he only had one request for the facility.

"I wanted the people, no matter where they sat, to be able to see the whole track," he said. "It turned out exactly how I wanted it to. It's not a little track, and I wouldn't change anything about it."

Jacobson said he rips the soil up about 20 to 24 inches deep in order to keep the soil soft and mellow.

Gramma's will host its first races this weekend, and Jacobson plans to host four

more yet this year and would like to have at least a dozen races next year.

"Everyone has liked the layout. It's safe dirt and the riders like it," Jacobson said. "We have gotten calls from Wyoming, Missouri and all over asking when the track would be done."

Jacobson added there are in between 200 and 300 entries for this weekend's race with a \$5,000 purse.

If Gramma's does draw well, Jacobson said he could expand the track.

"If we get a good turnout, then we would add restrooms and showers, and even hook-ups for campers," he said.

Jacobson said the adding on could cost another \$30,000, but he said money isn't an issue. "There's room to spend yet, but to see my kids happy, it's hard to put a price on that," Jacobson said with a smile.

will take the money because of federal regulations that might accompany it.

Heidepriem said it's a good bill that doesn't increase the nation's debt.

"This is an administration that accepted all the revitalization dollars, \$250 million to balance the budget over the last three years," said Heidepriem. "This administration accepted \$183 million earmarked for roads and bridges in the state of South Dakota, but when it comes to education this administration says no. Strings attached — we don't want it."

Daugaard said regulations yet to be written could force the state to spend money in ways

not fiscally responsible. He asked if school boards would have to fire teachers hired or retained with the money if it's not available next year.

"I am not willing to say that I will accept that money and spend it without knowing first what strings are attached," Daugaard said. "I think that's good government."

Heidepriem frequently referred to the Rounds-Daugaard administration and said it was "status quo" in many of Daugaard's responses to questions submitted from audience members.

Daugaard said at one point it was not his "duty" to defend Rounds' budget. He said he doesn't always agree with the governor but made a commitment when he became lieutenant governor not to publicly disagree with Rounds.
