**AARP Helps Investors Avoid Scams**

AARP South Dakota will host an open house Wednesday, Aug. 25, at Minerva's in Yankton followed by an Investor Protection "Lunch and Learn."

The open house begins at 11 a.m. and will feature informational materials on the new health care law, volunteering and other AARP programs and activities including Driver Safety and Tax-Aide. The open house is free and open to the public. AARP membership is not necessary to attend.

Following the open house, AARP South Dakota will hold a free Investor Protection "Lunch and Learn" featuring a presentation of "The Lure of Money." This presen-

tation is an overview of the deceptive tactics used in ponzi schemes, promissory notes, viaticals, variable annuities and affinity fraud. Real cases will be highlighted followed by tips to avoid becoming a victim of investment fraud. Agents from the South Dakota Division of Insurance will also provide information on fighting insurance fraud. The lunch and learn begins at 12:15 p.m., with lunch provided by AARP South Dakota.
