CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery sank 38 cents to \$6.9625 a bushel, while December corn fell 4.5 cents to \$4.2275 a bushel and oats for December delivery lost 1 cent to \$2.855 a bushel. November soybeans dropped 12.5 cents to \$10.315 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef and pork futures advanced on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle rose 1.1 cents to 96.17 cents a pound; October feeder cattle gained 1.73 cents to \$1.1315 a pound; October lean hogs inched up 0.2 cent to 74.85 cents a pound; and August pork bellies added 1 cent to \$1.39 a pound.
