said Congress should strip funding for the law to limit its harm. The exchange led to Herseth Sandlin's repeated charge that Noem would try to privatize Social Security and Medicare.

"Stephanie, stop scaring seniors," Noem responded. "I've not supported privatizing Medicare or Social Security."

In response to a question, Herseth Sandlin said she would be open to repealing the federal estate tax if the nation could afford it. But since the country is struggling with a large budget deficit, a limited estate tax likely needs to be retained, she said.

The estate tax has been reduced gradually over the past decade and was eliminated this year. But if Congress does nothing, the tax will be reinstated next year at high rates previously in effect.

Herseth Sandlin suggested the estate tax be kept at the reduced rate in effect last year.

Noem said the tax would hurt South Dakota farmers, ranchers and small businesses. After the debate, she said she favored extending the elimination of the tax until Congress figures out a

### GM Recalls 250K Vehicles; Seat Belts May Not Latch

WASHINGTON — General Motors Co. is recalling nearly 250,000 crossover vehicles worldwide to inspect second-row seat belts that could be damaged and not latch.

GM said Tuesday the recall affects 2009-2010 models of the Chevrolet Traverse, Buick Enclave, GMC Acadia and Saturn Outlook.

Most of the 243,403 recalled vehicles are in the United States but some are also in Canada, Mexico and elsewhere.

The Detroit automaker said the seat-belt buckle could be damaged when the seat back is returned to an upright position. That could make the buckle appear to latch when it isn't.

GM said it did not know of any cases where the second-row seat belts failed to perform properly in a crash.

GM spokesman Alan Adler said the plastic shield around the seat belt release button could get caught on some trim and not return to its normal position after the seats are folded flat. If enough force is applied when the seats are pushed back to their normal position, the shield around the release button could be pushed onto the button and make it malfunction.

Owners will be notified this month by mail and told to make an appointment with their dealer to get the problem fixed. Mechanics will trim the shield to allow more space for the buckle to return to its normal position and stay clear of the seats, Adler said.
