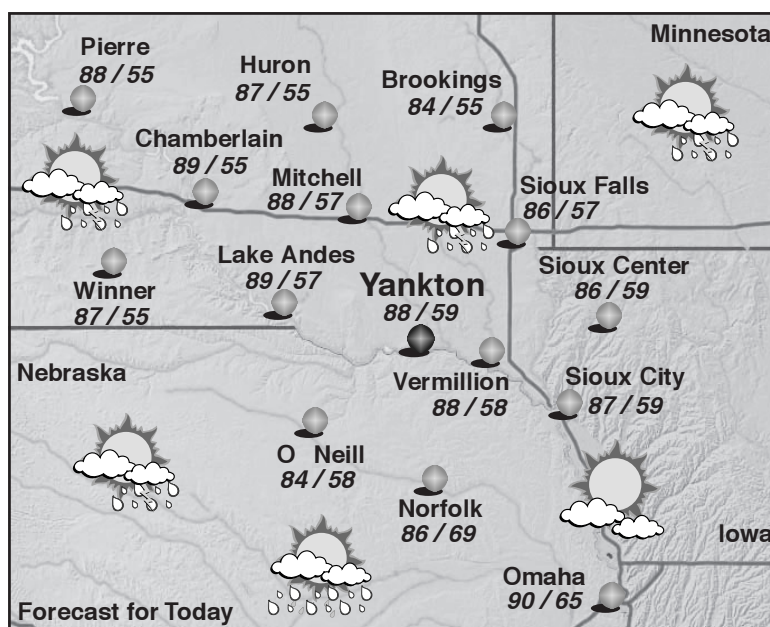

Drunk Driving Crackdown Now Under Way

PIERRE — Drinking drivers, be warned. South Dakota's Highway Patrol is joining other law enforcement agencies to increase drunk driving enforcement during a national campaign against impaired driving.

The national "Drunk Driving. Over the Limit, Under Arrest" crackdown runs through Labor Day, Sept. 6. Here's what you can expect from the Highway Patrol during the crackdown period — at least 15 scheduled sobriety checkpoints as well as numerous saturation patrols statewide. Many local law enforcement agencies also are stepping up their drunk driving enforcement activities during the period.

"We're telling motorists that we're going to be out in force during this period," said Maj. Randy Hartley, acting superintendent of the Highway Patrol. "We hope that will encourage people to make sure they have a sober driver in every vehicle. If it doesn't, we'll be out there to take them off the roads."

All 50 states have established .08 percent blood alcohol concentration as the legal limit for operating a vehicle, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The agency says nearly 12,000 people die each year in the United States in crashes that involve a driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol content higher than the legal limit. Nearly two-thirds of the drivers in those fatal crashes are between the ages of 21 and 34.

The national crackdown is a way to remind motorists of the dangers of drinking and driving, says Lee Axdahl, director of the South Dakota Office of Highway Safety.

"The goal of the increased enforcement is to keep South Dakota's roads fatality free," he said.
