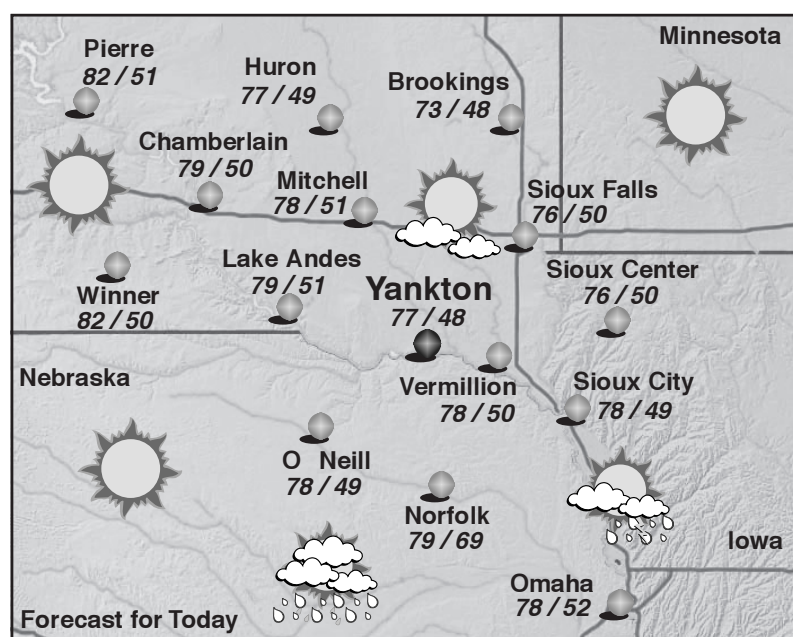

Driver Charged In Vermillion Hit-And-Run Accident

VERMILLION — The driver faces two charges in a Sunday evening hit-and-run accident in Vermillion that resulted in injuries to her passenger. The Vermillion Police Department is investigating the accident that occurred in the 300 block of East Main Street, according to Capt. Chad Passick. According to Vermillion Police Chief Art Mabry, the vehicle in the hit-and-run struck a

parked car. Officers immediately located the suspect's vehicle, which was occupied by two females. Both occupants were transported to Vermillion Sanford Hospital for treatment of injuries. The passenger was later transferred to Sioux Falls. The driver was charged with driving while intoxicated (DWI), second offense, and vehicular battery. The investigation is continuing. The names of the two females have not been released.
