Yankton's Jensen Named To Omaha Hockey Roster

OMAHA, Neb. — Bryce Jensen of Yankton was one of 15 players selected to play on the 13-14 Bantam AA Jr. Lancers national traveling hockey team out of Omaha, Neb. A total of 88 players tried out for the team. Luke Boose of Dakota Valley was also selected to the team. It marks the first time any players from South Dakota have played on the team. Jensen, 13, is the son of Cassandra and Wade Jensen.

SDSU 10th in FCS Coaches' Poll

BROOKINGS — The South Dakota State University football team holds the 10th-place ranking in the preseason Football Championship Subdivision Coaches Poll, which was released on Monday. The Jackrabbits, who also are ranked ninth in the preseason Sports Network/Fathead.com media poll, made their inaugural appearance in the FCS playoffs last season en route to an 8-4 overall record. Defending national champion Villanova (Pa.) received 22 of 28 first-place votes to claim the No. 1 ranking with 667 points. Montana was second with 632 points and two first-place votes, followed by Appalachian State (N.C.) with 622 points and four first-place votes. SDSU tallied 403 points for its 10th-place showing. The Missouri Valley Football Conference has three teams in the Top 25: Southern Illinois (fifth), SDSU (10th) and Northern Iowa (13th), with three others — Illinois State, Missouri State and Youngstown State — receiving votes. The Jackrabbits open the season Sept. 11 at Delaware, which is ranked 19th in the coaches' poll with 185 points.

Hoffman Twins Help Rock County Robins Win WBCBL National Title

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — University of South Dakota graduates Jena and Jenna Hoffman helped the Rock County Robins (Wis.) win the Women's Blue Chip Basketball League National Championship this past weekend in Miami Gardens, Fla. The Hoffman twins, who keyed USD's run to the national championship game in 2008, are part of the semi-pro team based in Wisconsin. In the championship game of the tournament, Jenna Hoffman had 15 points and nine rebounds to lead the Robins to a 71-67 win over the Gulf Coast Storm. The Robins opened national tournament play on Saturday with an 88-58 rout of the Lauderdale Lions. In the semifinals, the Robins edged the Miami Rain, 65-60, keyed by 11 points from Jenna Hoffman. The Hoffman twins were in their first year as members of the Rock County Robins, who finished with a 10-1 record.

DWU's Guthmiller Awarded State Athletic Training Award

"He's familiar with the process; he knows what he has to do." The process from catching a fish to it potentially becoming a state-certified is a record can be "lengthy," according to Bauer. First, the fish must be weighed on a certified scale capable of exacting specific measurements. During that step, the weighing has to be witnessed by at least one GP Commission fisheries biologist who confirms the species. The fisherman must have a valid fishing permit for that state, the fish must be taken legally from state waters, and the fish must beat the previous record by at least an ounce — otherwise it is considered a tie. One of the locations where Wiebelhaus has frequently brought his record fish to be weighed has been Norfolk, Neb.

"I'm betting the guys at the UPS store in Norfolk know him by name," joked Bauer. "Not many places have professional scales that would be able to handle something that big." The most recent record fish shot by Wiebelhaus will — like many of his previous catches — be taken to Lewon's Taxidermy Studio in Randolph, Neb., where Wiebelhaus said it will be mounted in the showroom. Though he admits to losing track of how many state records he owns, Wiebelhaus said the ultimate goal is not to get the biggest fish possible, but instead to enjoy the challenge. "The way I look at it, state records are meant to be broken," he said. In the same press release certifying Wiebelhaus' record grass carp, Ron Anderson of Omaha, Neb., was listed as setting a new archery record for silver carp. The irony there is that Wiebelhaus previously owned that record as well. "Ron and I are bow-fishing partners, and we've gone back and forth for a long time now," Wiebelhaus said. "When I got this (record) for the grass carp, it was Ron's that I broke. It's a cycle with the two of us." The holder of two Bow Fishing Association of America world records, Wiebelhaus said he'll continue to fish as long as he can, and that given as much time as he spends on the water, he might have to make more trips to Norfolk. According to Wiebelhaus, the best way to snag a giant carp is two-fold: "First, an angler should be patient and wait for a big fish, instead of shooting a bunch of smaller ones which produces a commotion that scares away any bigger carp." "Secondly, he said specific times of the year work better because carp are on the surface feeding and spawning. "It's obvious that Marilyn knows what he's doing," Bauer said. "I doubt this will be the last time we hear his name."
