Missing A Deadline: I Blew It

Don't you hate it when you realize you have missed something? I do.

I am the kind of guy who likes to be some place on time, or better 20 minutes early. Just ask my wife, when I am late I am a rather impatient person. Maybe you had better not ask my wife...

Why mention this today? Because I was supposed to have this into the paper on Wednesday and I remembered it Thursday evening. Now I had a choice to make, after all the people at the *Yankton Daily Press* and *Dakotan* do a great job of getting that paper put together each week and all they ask of a few of us area pastors is to write a little article about four times a year and now I go and blow my deadline.

Do I feel like a mess up or what? To make matters worse all during the week I have been looking at this reminder on my calendar telling me to write an article, so instead of getting to it, I procrastinated and now I am probably too late to make the deadline. Maybe the editor will use this some other time when I or one of my colleagues misses

the deadline. Now missing a deadline for an article may not seem like such a big deal for you, but for me it is a problem, after all I want to be prompt. Then again it is not like I committed a felony, or something like that. Maybe for you, the problem is you have done something more than just miss a deadline. Maybe you have done something that you wish you could undo but know that there is no way to undo the damage that has been done. What can you do now?

You can run, head out of state and hope the people you care about will forget you. You can pretend that someone else is to blame hoping that no one sees the guilty look on your face. Or you can admit that "I blew it". I messed up and no one else is to blame for the mess I am in.

The problem with the first two is that where ever you go, there you are and when you look in the mirror your face will accuse you, so even if you leave town or convince

the world that someone else is to blame, you will always know it was you who is really at fault.

I wonder if you have ever heard words like these: "If we say, 'We aren't sinful' we are deceiving ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

God is faithful and reliable. If we confess our sins, he forgives them and cleanses us from everything we've done wrong.

Those words come from the Bible and remind us that the only way to be free from the times when we have messed up, sinned, blew it, whatever term you want to use, the way to deal with it is found in admitting to God that we are not perfect and need his help to get our life in order.

I have an invitation for you, why don't you ask God to help you admit your mistakes. The reason I suggest that is because God is more ready to forgive us than we are to forgive ourselves most of the time. So try it and see what happens.

Next time, I will make my reminder bigger so I can write about something none of us knows anything about. But knowing myself as well as I do, I have a hunch this is not the last time I will have to admit I blew it.

Lakeport Church Celebration Set For Sept. 12

The 27th annual celebration of the state's oldest standing chalk-stone church, Lakeport or St. John the Baptist Catholic, begins with a 10:30 a.m. mass there on Sunday, Sept. 12.

The general public is invited to attend. This year the dedication will be to the little town of Janousek. A potluck meal follows at the American Legion Hall in Tabor.

The church, located 10 miles west of Yankton along Highway 50, is also the last remaining building of what was once the village of Lakeport. St. John the Baptist Catholic Church was built in 1884 — one of a number of buildings erected by Czech immigrants who settled in the Lakeport area in 1869.

Rev. Joseph Puthenkulathil, priest of St. Wenceslaus Church, Tabor, will celebrate the special mass on Sunday, Sept. 12.

Lakeport was located along the Sioux City to Ft. Randall Military Road. The famed General Custer camped there. Other military passed through there also, some as early as 1856.

As Czech immigrants settled there, they established a post office, church, school, hotel, community center and other businesses.
