rain in a few hours and a total of 13 inches of rain in an 80-hour period.

Wednesday's concert should run about an hour and will offer a more intimate atmosphere, Nanji said. The concert will feature Nanji and his wife, Leah.

"We have been performing together for a while. She does the singing," Mato said.

The band recently released a new CD, "Acoustic Sessions."

Wednesday's concert was put together on short notice because of scheduling reasons, Nanji said.

"We are going on tour later this week. We are doing a couple of shows over in Europe and are leaving on Friday. That's why it's short notice," he said.

Mato Nanji attended Marty Indian School, so the concert represents a way to help his alma mater. He also sees it as a way to benefit local American Indian youth and promote their participation in athletics.

"I grew up there and went to school there," Nanji said. "That's one of the reasons why I said I would love to do (the concert)."

Greg Zepher, a Yankton Sioux tribal councilman and Nanji's brother, said the benefit concert would meet the immediate need of buying shoes for the cross-

country team.

"The runners can't afford their own shoes. Right now, they are running in street shoes," Zepher said. "We needed to hold the concert before Mato left for Europe, but we also wanted to buy shoes before the first cross-country meet Sept. 9 at Corsica."

The money could also be used for refurbishing the football field, allowing Marty to hold its first home football games since 1985, Zepher said. The Braves football team has held its home games at neighboring Andes Central in Lake Andes.

The Marty Indian School was hit hard by this summer's flooding and doesn't have the funds for immediate needs, including the running shoes, Zepher said.

The Yankton Sioux Tribe has also used up available funds for flood relief, Zepher said. A \$100,000 grant from the Shakopee tribe of Minnesota has already been distributed to Yankton Sioux tribal members, he said.

"Our tribal hall was damaged by the flood, and we have other needs," he said.

Zach McComas, box office manager for Dakota Theatre, said doors will open at 6:30 p.m. for Wednesday's concert. Tickets can be purchased at the door on the night of the concert, he said.

Hazardous Waste Collection Event Planned

Two household hazardous waste collections will be held in early October.

The first will be from noon to 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 1, at the Vermillion Missouri Valley Recycling Center, 840 N. Crawford Road, Vermillion. On Oct. 2, a household hazardous waste collection will be held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Yankton Transfer Station & Recycling Center, 23rd and Kellen Gross Drive, Yankton.

There is a \$10 fee per vehicle to help defray the collection cost.

This collection provides opportunities for residents to safely dispose of products containing harmful chemicals. Unless used and disposed of according to directions, these household chemicals present a threat to the environment. Special handling is required to dispose of them properly. Materials collected are recycled, or disposed in hazardous waste landfills or incinerators. A licensed private company under contract to the Missouri Valley Recycling Center provides these services.

Examples of household hazardous waste include:

- Cleaning supplies — room deodorizers, oven cleaner; sanitizer; drain cleaners; toilet bowl cleaners; NiCad batteries; floor polish; silver and metal polishes; nail polish; furniture polish; mothballs; floor wax; disinfectants; and powdered bleach.
- Household products — fluorescent bulbs; mercury switches and thermometers; bug sprays; flea collars; peroxides; and medicines.

- Shop, hobby area and repair supplies — latex paint; oil based paint; used oil; used anti-freeze; cleaners, thinners and solvents; lubricants, glues and adhesives; stains, strippers and preservatives; lead acid batteries; oil filters; and containers with unknown substances.
- Yard, garden, and farm supplies — pesticides, herbicides and other products.

The state Department of Agriculture will be on site to receive farm products.

Why should you clean your house of unusable or unwanted household hazardous waste (HHW)? Certain types of HHW have the potential to cause physical injury to sanitation workers, contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems if poured down drains or toilets, and present hazards to children and pets if left around the house. Read product labels for disposal directions to reduce the risk of products exploding, igniting, leaking, mixing with other chemicals, or posing other hazards on the way to a disposal facility. Even empty containers of HHW can pose hazards because of the residual chemicals that might remain.

You can help reduce HHW disposal costs. In 2009, Missouri River Recycling paid over \$20,000 to dispose of HHW received from residents. Although proper disposal of HHW is important, it is even more important to avoid purchasing hazardous items and substitute them with non-hazardous alternatives.

You can help reduce the cost of this program by:

- avoiding the purchase of hazardous household materials;
- using up what you buy;
- giving away what you cannot use; and
- using safer alternatives.
