Fire Destroys Mobile Home In Rural Mission Hill

MISSION HILL — A fire in rural Mission Hill Friday destroyed a double-wide mobile home with an attached garage.

Yankton's deputy fire chief, Larry Nickels, said the home along Chris Road was in poor condition and not inhabited, but the garage had some valuables in it.

"(The property owners) had intended to tear (the home) down," he stated. "The significant loss was a couple cars in the garage. One was a classic car that had been purchased to restore. There were also a lot of tools."

A house located about 75 feet away from the blaze that is occupied by the property owners received some minor heat damage. They reported the fire.

"The owner of the home heard a pop and looked outside," Nickels said. "The building was totally engulfed in smoke."

An attempt was made by one of the property owners to get the collectible car out of the garage, but the heat made it impossible. The cause of the fire was undetermined, Nickels said.

In addition to the Yankton Fire Department, the Gayville Fire Department was also on the scene. Crews were on site for approximately two hours.
