

## City To Consider Change In Landfill Rates

The Yankton City Commission will consider raising tipping fees for the Joint Vermillion/Yankton Solid Waste System by 10 percent Monday.

The increase would be effective October 3.

The commission will also hold a first reading of the city's proposed 2012 budget and consider awarding a contract for paving an alley between Cedar and Walnut streets from Riverside Drive to Second Street.

The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

## Thursday's Rain Totals Varied Across Area

Yankton was at the center of the heavy rain received during Thursday's storms.

The city's official weather observing station recorded a total of 1.86 inches of rain, while the airport had a total of 2.07.

However, there were reports of 3-5 inches from certain locations in town and in the county.

Meanwhile, Vermillion officials saw .37 from the storm, but readers also reported from .50 to .75 in other parts of the community.

To the west, Pickstown recorded .75 of rain.

Yankton also saw numerous reports of damage due to hail and wind, primarily to windows and sidings.

## Crest Road To Open Until Next Rehab Phase

The current phase of rehabilitation of the Gavins Point Powerplant intake crane is coming to a close. On Monday, Aug. 22, the road that crosses Gavins Point Dam, also known as Crest Road, will be closed from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. At 5 p.m., it will reopen for normal traffic through approximately Oct. 3.

The second phase of the rehabilitation program will begin at that time. During the second phase, the road will be closed seven days a week 24 hours a day for approximately a month.

CitizenReady® training is a standardized, national disaster health education program that can help meet citizen and community preparedness goals and objectives specified in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' National Health Security Strategy.

## Agencies Unite To Target Drunk Driving

PIERRE — The South Dakota Highway Patrol and Office of Highway Safety are joining forces with more than 60 local law enforcement agencies for a pre-Labor Day crackdown on impaired driving.

The combined effort is part of an annual national campaign that runs through Sept. 5 this year. The campaign uses a combination of enforcement, education and awareness to spread the message that drinking and driving is both illegal and dangerous. The crackdown is supported by \$14 million in paid national advertising to raise awareness of the pitfalls of impaired driving.

Information from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration shows that in 2009 alone, more than 10,800 people died in crashes in which a driver or motorcycle rider was at or above the legal limit. The 21-24 age group had the highest percentage of alcohol-impaired driving fatalities in traffic crashes, the NHTSA data shows.

In South Dakota, the campaign slogan is "DUI:DOA," a reminder that impaired driving has no positive outcomes. Participating agencies will use a combination of sobriety checkpoints, high-visibility saturation patrols and educational presentations to carry the message.

"We would love it if education and awareness alone would work," said Col. Craig Price, superintendent of the South Dakota Highway Patrol. "We would prefer that every driver make the safe choice. Some drivers simply don't do that, and our message to them is pretty simple. If we find you driving impaired, you will be arrested and charged."

Last year in South Dakota, 49 people died and 646 were injured in alcohol-involved crashes. Office of Accident Records statistics show 26 percent of drivers in fatal crashes last year had been drinking.
