# SDVMA Holds Annual Meeting

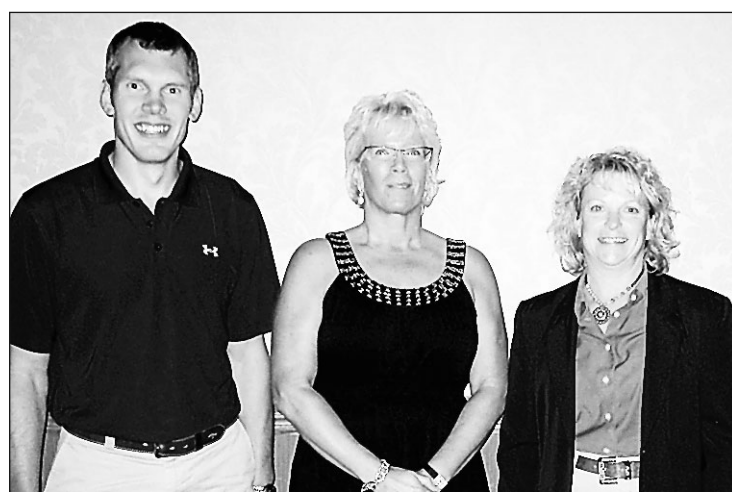
The South Dakota Veterinary Medical Association held its 120th Annual Meeting at the Ramkota Convention Center in Sioux Falls Aug. 7-10. The meeting included continuing education opportunities for 200 veterinarians and veterinary technicians, recognized outstanding accomplishments by professionals in the veterinary fields, and included the annual membership meeting.

The meeting featured sessions on companion animal, food animal, and equine medicine, and included case reports from SDSU Animal Disease Research and Diagnostic Lab faculty involving current animal disease issues.

Dr. Jim Bain of Frederick, was honored as Veterinarian of the Year. This award is given in recognition of a colleague for their work in, and contributions to, the veterinary profession. SDVMA recognizes these contributions by awarding the Veterinarian of the Year to a veterinarian who has made significant contributions to the profession.

Dr. Bain is a third generation veterinarian following in the footsteps of his father, Les Bain, and his grandfather, Hank Bain. Dr. Bain attended three years at South Dakota State University before moving to Columbia, Missouri, where he received his DVM from the University of Missouri.
