Residents and business owners can register by calling 800-621-FEMA (3362), TTY 800-462-7585, or online at www.disasterassistance.gov. The toll-free line will be in operation from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. CDT seven days a week until further notice.

That way, their application will be put on hold and won't be processed, but their information will be in the

pipeline so if and when the county is added, FEMA will have that information," Mooney said.

Yankton County Emergency Management director Paul Scherschligt said he has not received any calls from local residents concerned about the county not being included in Tuesday's announcement but encouraged them to follow FEMA's advice to register.

"Anything that can be done to help along the system for the recovery effort is important," he said.

When calling to register, FEMA advises people to have the following information available:

- a current telephone number;
• an address at the time of the disaster and a current address;
• a Social Security number;
• a general list of damages and losses;

- if insured, the name of the company, agent and policy number; and
• a bank account and routing number for direct deposit of funds if you become eligible.

FEMA's individual assistance program can help with such things as home repair, temporary housing, grants for serious disaster-related needs and expenses not covered by insurance or other assistance programs.

It covers basic needs only and does not normally compensate eligible applicants for the entire loss. FEMA disaster aid is generally offered as grants that do not have to be paid back.

According to Daugaard, FEMA last approved individual assistance in South Dakota to flood victims in Aberdeen. They were given an average of just under \$2,000.

Neb. Schools To Get Free Energy-Use Assessments

LINCOLN, Neb. — Public schools across Nebraska have an opportunity to receive free energy use assessments to identify opportunities for energy and resource improvements.

"I am very pleased that nearly one-third of the schools in the state have already responded with their data," said Energy Office Director Ginger Willson. "For most schools, it will take about an hour to gather and submit the information needed for the assessment."

"I hope many more schools will submit their information by the Aug. 31 deadline," Director Willson said.

"Today there are so many competing uses for limited school funds. I don't want any school to miss this chance."

The Nebraska Public School Energy Efficiency Project is a three-part effort to help schools use analytical tools to help them find potential energy and resource savings. Under Phase One, schools submit energy use data for 18 months along with specifics about the building.

This activity is being paid for with U.S. Department of Energy State Energy Program/American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds received by the Nebraska Energy Office.
