Memories, You Will Take Them With You

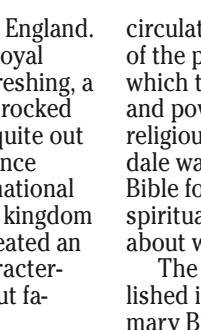
In preparing a slide presentation of some of my 15 years of Railroad experience for the Kiwanis Club and the Missouri Valley Train Club, many memories were stirred up from the experiences that helped finance my way through college and seminary. Slides from the 1950's that I had not seen for at least a decade reminded me of my English heritage through my mother (Hodges family) and father (Mason family) both families being basically English. This is partly because the first railroad company I worked for was financed by British interests and originally named Grand Trunk after the highway system of India. Today it is known as CN and now comes as close to Yankton as Sioux City, Iowa due to recent mergers. Back in 1940 when I was eight years old I remember reading British literature at my grandparent's home in Toronto, Canada, which described the British Union Jack. This flag presided over Canada at that time. I read about this flag and how it was to be properly displayed. After I got back home in the Detroit area I found a book on the American flag and found the literature to be almost identical, except for what flag that was. At this time the English expansion had reached its greatest extent, and claimed that the Sun never set on the British Empire. This was based on the fact that

India, Australia, Canada, Hong Kong and many other parts of the world displayed the Union Jack over any other flag that they had. Today the United Kingdom only consists of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The British Confederation does include all former colonies, now being basically independent, for favorable trade and protection. Today an entirely different picture appears to be emerging of England. Aside from the recent Royal Wedding which was refreshing, a picture of a nation now rocked with social unrest and quite out of step with what was once viewed proudly as the national character of a powerful kingdom emerges. Britain has created an atmosphere that is characterized by "children without fathers, schools without discipline, reward without effort, crime without punishment, rights without responsibilities and communities without control." as quoted by British Prime Minister David Cameron. To be able to remember Britain for what it was and see it today for what it is makes one ask "has that nation lost its soul?"

From England in its history came a great spiritual awaking. This made it possible for the commoners to read the Scriptures themselves through the efforts of William Tyndale. Tyndale, not to be confused with John Tyndall which the nearby community of Tyndall was named, was executed in Europe before he was able to complete his translation of the Scriptures into English. Fleeing to Europe because of opposition he was able to consult with Luther and his associate Melancthon. In spite of Tyndale's death, the Scriptures were completed and circulated. A spiritual awakening of the people started to develop which threatened the security and power of the political and religious hierarchy. After Tyndale was executed the Geneva Bible followed and the power of spiritual awakening spread about with amazing results. The Geneva Bible was published in 1560 which was the primary Bible of the 16th century. It is known to have been used by William Shakespeare, Oliver Cromwell, John Milton, John Know, John Donne and John Bunyan who wrote Pilgrim's Progress. It was also taken to America on the Mayflower. The King James Bible authorized by James I was not readily accepted at the time of publication in 1611. It emphasized the divine sovereignty of kings and failed, as has other English translations, to translate the Greek word "baptizo" but rather to transliterate as "baptize" be-

cause of the controversy over the correct meaning that still exists today. The proper meaning is something that everyone should check out. Going farther back in history, one of the wealthiest if not the wealthiest person in the world was Israel's King Solomon. He is remembered as one who had it all. He had the greatest wealth, women (700 wives, 300 concubines) wisdom and power on record. After having had all of this and more, King Solomon writes in his old age the book of Ecclesiastes having a theme of how empty all this turned out to be. He tried it all, but it did not bring what he was looking for. He leaves with us this advise, "remember your creator in the days of your youth, while the evil days come not, not he years draw nigh, when you shall say, I have no pleasure in this." Indeed, all our wealth and possessions we will leave behind. But I am convinced that our memories will go with us. The frustrations we face in life are those bad memories that can haunt us. These can be forgiven and forgotten through establishing a personal relationship with Jesus, the one who overcame sin and death. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the father but by me." If you have not done so, ask Jesus to take His proper place in your life so that you will be able to build the best memories possible to take with you into eternity! "Hope to see you there!"
