dates train for many hours on basic military tasks including physical training, drill and ceremony and troop leading procedures. During the training, the candidates are placed in high-stress, high-intensity environments and challenged to make leadership decisions.

Schloss will branch Transportation and will be assigned to the South Dakota Army National Guard's 740th Transportation Company in Milbank.

Schloss lives in Vermillion where he recently graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Chemistry from the University of South Dakota. He is the son of Barry and Sandra Schloss of Yankton.

**Johnson Announces Cancer Screenings For S.D. State Fair**

SIoux FALLS — Sen. Tim Johnson (D-S.D.) has announced that the Cancer Awareness and Prevention Booth and a Mammogram Van will be available at the South Dakota State Fair in Huron, which runs from Sept. 1-5.

The Mammogram Van will offer free mammograms to women with appointments on Friday, Sept. 2, running from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) testing will be offered every day for the duration of the State Fair.

Since 2000, Johnson and his wife, Barbara, have held cancer screenings at the South Dakota State Fair and provided fairgoers the opportunity to learn more about the disease. The Johnsons have spearheaded efforts to educate the public about the risks of cancer and the benefits of early detection.

"As a cancer survivor myself, I have personally learned the importance of early detection," said Johnson, who received successful treatment after being diagnosed with prostate cancer. "I strongly encourage fairgoers to visit the Mammo-

gram Van and Cancer Booth to learn more about cancer, prevention and early detection."

Free screenings for prostate cancer will be available for the duration of the fair at the Cancer Awareness and Prevention Booth. Health care professionals from the Huron Regional Medical Center will be conducting PSA testing. No appointment is necessary. The PSA test is a simple blood test that is used to detect cancer of the prostate.

On Friday, Sept. 2 Avera McKennan will conduct free mammograms to screen for breast cancer, but appointments are necessary.

Individuals without health insurance coverage or with high deductibles should schedule an appointment by calling Senator Johnson's toll-free office line: 1-800-537-0025. They may also stop by the cancer booth at the fair on Thursday, Sept. 1, and Friday, Sept. 2, to schedule an appointment. Participants will be asked to fill out a form, and first priority will be given to those without access to health insurance or adequate care.

Beef Basket Challenge. Holly and Charlie will be given a basket of ingredients, including beef, at the start of the competition. They then have one hour to rustle up what they hope will be a winning dish. The public will be able to taste a sample and vote for a People's Choice Award.

Karla Pazour, chairwoman of the South Dakota Beef Cook-Off, says both the Cook-Off and the Beef Basket Challenge have been popular events with the fair-going public. "These are really fun events that allow the audience to interact," said Pazour. "It's also exciting to see that you can prepare a fabulous beef meal in a short amount of time."

The day also includes a 2:30 p.m. book signing of Levi's Lost Calf by new author Amanda Radke, a fifth-generation South Dakota rancher and past South Dakota and National Beef Ambassador. Radke's book shows young readers what life is like on a cattle ranch.
