MISSION HILL — U.S. Postal Service (USPS) officials are holding a public meeting at 1 p.m. today (Tuesday) at the Mission Hill city hall concerning the proposed closure of the Mission Hill post office.

The meeting is part of the process for deciding whether to proceed with closing a particular post office, said Karen Fredrickson, USPS marketing manager for the Dakotas District.

At the meetings, USPS officials explain the closure process and take comments from the public, Fredrickson said. The Mission Hill post office serves the 57046 ZIP Code area.

The hearing for the Davis post office, which serves 57021, will be held at 10 a.m. today at the Davis fire hall.

The meeting for the Volin post office, also on the closure list, has been set for 10 a.m. Friday at the post office. The Volin facility serves the 57071 ZIP Code area.

Fredrickson hasn't received a date for the public meeting for Olivet, which is on the proposed closure list and serves the 57052 ZIP Code.

No postal closure meetings have been set yet for the 573 area, Fredrickson said. The ZIP Code includes Dimock, serving 57331.
