



- A delegation of Yankton officials and residents are standing ready to go to Pierre to confer with the state highway department and officials of the bureau of public roads on the matter of failure of the bureau of public roads to approve bids on the construction of state trunk highway No. 50 through Yankton and east through Yankton county.
- A conference will be held today between W. L. Van Osdel, police and fire commissioner, and H. A. Doyle, city attorney, for the purpose of preparing an ordinance which will meet the request of the Retail Merchants' association of Yankton for a one-hour parking limit on certain downtown business streets. At the same time it is proposed to make changes in the entire traffic ordinance which will provide for inside left turns at intersections and adopt other uniform state-wide traffic regulations to facilitate the movement of and safety to traffic in Yankton.

50 YEARS AGO

- Before a crowd of well over 1,000 on Riverside diamond last night, the Yankton Lakers pulled out a 7 to 4 victory over the Menno Wolves in the final game of the Lewis & Clark league playoffs.
