#### **Centerville Woman Dies In Car Crash**

DAVIS - A Centerville woman died in a two-vehicle collision on Thursday at the intersection of U.S. Highway 18 and 466th Avenue about five miles east of Davis in Lincoln County.

Dorthy Elizabeth Larson, 79, was driving a 2002 Chevrolet Malibu north on 466th Avenue. She came to a stop at the intersection with Highway 18 and then began to cross the highway. Her vehicle was struck by an eastbound 2000 Peterbilt semi-tractor pulling double tanker trailers.

Larson died at the scene.

The driver of the Peterbilt, Gregory Ray Benson, 26, of Hurley, was uninjured. Both drivers were wearing seatbelts and were the only occupants in their vehicles.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating. Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, Lennox Fire Rescue, Lennox Police Department and Lennox Ambulance assisted.

# **Drought Monitor Largely Unchanged** Todey says recipitation totals, though, were not sufficient to indi-

BROOKINGS - Conditions on the U.S. Drought Monitor were largely unchanged except for a small area over the Black Hills which was reduced from Extreme Drought (D3) to Severe Drought(D2), says Dennis Todey, SDSU state climatologist.

'Recent rainfalls over the area and somewhat cooler conditions reduced the impact of the drought conditions," Todey said. "Over the last 30 days the central Black Hills have actually received above average precipitation."

Although this has helped ease some concerns, Todey says the Black Hills remain in Severe Drought. He adds that the rains have also helped green-up some pasture and rangeland in some areas of the west, helping ease the fire danger slightly. The rest of the drought status statewide was unchanged, as some precipitation and cooler temperatures keep conditions from worsening.

# City To Consider Town Hall Meeting For Sports Complexes

The Yankton City Commission will consider Monday holding a town hall meeting later this month to gain input as it considers hiring a consultant to look at the community's sports facility needs.

Mayor Nancy Wenande said during a media briefing Friday that commissioners have received positive and negative feedback since they agreed last month to put out a request for proposals from consultants to study the issue. The deadline for receiing the proposals is Aug. 27.

"We, as the commission, would like to give the opportunity to the public to have a broader voice in that discussion," she stated.

The town hall would be moderated by Greg Henderson of Planning and Development District Ill. The proposed event would be held in the theater at the Summit Activities Center on either Monday, Aug. 20, or Tuesday, Aug. 21.

The agenda for the meeting would be:

· Public comments on current facilities and programming;

• Public comments on future

facilities and what citizens believe are needed: and

• Other comments and questions regarding athletic facilities or future facilities.

"If there is something that is in question, their opportunity to ask about it would be (at this meeting)," Wenande said.

Other items on Monday's City Commission agenda include a grant application for the Chan Gurney Airport, setting a hearing date for a dangerous building appeal and closing out the Meridian Bridge Plaza project.


