

MMC Practical Nursing Pinning Ceremony Held

The Mount Marty College nursing program held the very first Pinning Ceremony for the August 2012 graduating Practical Nursing students on Friday, August 3, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. These graduates of this program earned their Certificate in Practical Nursing.

The Pinning Ceremony at Mount Marty began in 1986 for the BSN program and in 2012 for the Practical Nursing program. The purpose of the event is to acknowledge the achievement of the graduate as they transition from the student role to the practice role. The nurse's pin incorporates the philosophy of the school and of the nursing program. The presentation of the pin represents a sending forth or commissioning of the students to begin their nursing careers as graduates of MMC.

Tradition defines that the nursing pin is unique to the nursing program from which the student graduates. In the past, a nurse's cap and pin represented the school from which he or she attended. Today, Mount Marty's pin remains as the lone symbol of their education.

Each element of the MMC nursing pin represents an aspect of the nurse's dedication. Mount

Yankton College Alumni Open Doors To Education

Opening doors to education and celebrating their 50th anniversary at the 2012 Yankton College All-Class Reunion were the reasons for the Yankton College Class of 1962 to establish the Class of 1962 Scholarship fund. Initiated by Carol (Kasulka '62) Boos of Tucson, Arizona, to create an ongoing gift to perpetuate the memory of Yankton College, Boos made the first contribution to the fund. Some of her classmates quickly joined in to create financial assistance to a deserving high school senior bound for college. Thinking it would be a one-time \$1,000 award, contributing classmates were genuinely surprised when the contributions kept on growing. Two additional \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded in the next two years and there is talk between them that more contributions are on the way.

Writing to each classmate, Boos said "Imagine the excitement of receiving a scholarship.

Envision someone who really needs the money to take the edge off an already tight budget. The scholarship money would open the door to an education."

The Class of 1962 Scholarship is included in the Yankton College Scholarship Program. The named scholarships are awarded each spring to high school seniors and post-graduate students. Eighteen Yankton College scholarships at \$1,000 each were awarded then including the first of the Class of 1962 award.

The Class of 1962 wondered what they might leave behind in remembrance and today, their legacy lives on, providing students an opportunity to continue their education, just like the one they received at Yankton College fifty years ago.
