Wheat for September delivery fell 28.50 cents to \$8.5675 a bushel; December corn fell 17 cents to \$7.9225 a bushel; December oats fell 14.25 cents to \$3.7050 a bushel; while November soybeans dropped 43 cents to \$16.0075 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle rose 0.85 cent to \$1.2637 a pound; October feeder cattle added 2.60 cents to \$1.4347 a pound; while October lean hogs rose 1.53 cent to 77.05 cents a pound.
