Lake Andes Man Arrested For Burglaries

LAKE ANDES — A Lake Andes man has been arrested for a string of burglaries in South Dakota and Nebraska, according to a news release.

The individual has been identified as 21-year-old Dustin Johnson, according to authorities.

Charles Mix County Sheriff Randy Thaler said his office received a warrant and conducted

a search Tuesday on a Lake Andes residence. The search recovered numerous items allegedly stolen from several businesses and individuals. These burglaries and thefts allegedly occurred in Platte, Pickstown and Lake Andes, all located in Charles Mix County.

Property was also discovered from alleged burglaries of businesses in Fairfax, Delmont, Tripp and Avon, and from several

businesses located in Boyd County, Neb.

The total dollar amount of recovered money and property is still being calculated.

The investigation continues by the Charles Mix County Sheriff's Office with the assistance of the Boyd County, Neb., Sheriff's Office and the South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI).

Rural Knox County Home Damaged In Brush Fire

A Wednesday brush fire in northern Knox County just west of Gavins Point Dam caused some damage to the home, but the situation could have been worse.

According to Yankton Assistant Fire Chief Larry Nickles, a fire of unknown origin was reported at approximately 12:45 p.m. Some tall pine trees next to the house were ignited. The house sustained damage on the window frames, and several gutters were melted. However, the house had cement-board siding, "and that probably saved it from burning," Nickles said.

The heat and flames moved down into a heavily wooded valley, but was eventually contained.

The Crofton Fire Department initially responded to the blaze and was assisted by Yankton firefighters.
