can help the conference build on its reputation. "I think the thing that makes a great conference is great competition every time you take the playing surface," he said.

The league has been dumped on at times over the past two years as longtime members have headed toward the door. Bowlsby believes there's stability ahead as he tries to conclude negotiations on a television contract worth as much as a \$2.6 billion, along with a written agreement among the 10 schools to give their grant of rights to the conference.

The latter part of that deal would be as close as the league can come to ensuring that no more schools will leave, since

they would have to forfeit millions upon millions of TV dollars to do so.

"There are no real stumbling blocks. It's a matter of just fine-tuning the wording and some things like that. I think the kind of rights will fall into place almost automatically," said University of Oklahoma President David Boren, seated next to Bowlsby.

If Bowlsby can complete that, it might finally be time for the change to slow down for a while and for the conference to get back to talking about championships instead of its possible extinction. "What enhances athletic reputation? Winning," Bowlsby said. "And it isn't just winning conference championships. It's having our conference champion go on and win national championships. We're going to do that. We've had a rich tradition of it, and we're going to continue to do it."

ELMHURST, Ill. — The Summit League named South Dakota State middle blocker Kelli Fiegen its offensive player of the week on Monday, after the senior led the Jackrabbits to a 2-2 record over the weekend at the Hawkeye Challenge, earning all-tournament team honors in the process.

"Kelli continues to work hard being an attacking option for her setters time and time again," head coach Phil McDaniel said. "She gave a solid effort this past weekend, and both Kelli, as well as our staff, have high expectations for her in her senior season."

Fiegen, a senior from Parkersburg, garnered her fourth career offensive player of the week award, and first of the season, after hitting on a .460 clip or better in all

three of her complete matches, including two matches with only one error. She opened the season hitting .474 with 10 kills and one error in 19 attempts and six blocks in a 3-0 sweep of Southeast Missouri State, and ended the tournament with her most efficient match of the weekend against Valparaiso with 13 kills and one error in 21 attempts for a .571 hitting percentage.

On the weekend, Fiegen collected 41 kills, averaging 3.15 per set with a league-best .459 hitting percentage, adding 12 blocks in the process.
