there is, and we've demonstrated over the last nine years that we can compete, and we can successfully implement technology across the world.'

The announcement that Eagle Creek was coming to Vermillion was made in the spring.

Steve Howe, executive di-rector of the Vermillion Chamber & Development Center (VCDC), said that there has been "a great amount of activity since that time," with Eagle Creek and the University of South Dakota collaborating on a training class and establishing a data graduate program at the Beacom School of Business. Earlier this year, Howe es-

timated an opening date for the facility as being the end of next April or the beginning of next May.

When it is completed, the Eagle Creek facility will bring approximately 200 new jobs to Vermillion, Howe said Tuesday.

'The impact that these jobs will have on the local economy is really going to change what Vermillion and other communities in the state are going to look like," Howe said.

Berhrendt said about 80 to 90 percent of the incoming staff will relocate to Vermillion from outside South

This is possible, he said, because the community and the university are "great.'

Those are the attributes that allow us to bring the staff here," he said. "Our commitment is to 200 people here in Vermillion. We'll have a 32,000 square foot facility. We'll be able to house 200 people, and we know we're going to get

Ustad said the Eagle Creek project serves to fulfill one of the state's primary objectives.

"From the state's perspective, one of our goals is to provide quality job opportunities for South Dakotans, and part of that is providing greater opportunities, or more opportunities, for college graduates ... to stay here and pursue their careers," he said. "I think Eagle Creek provides that opportunity.'

have at least 100 people at Eagle Creek by the end of next year.

Howe concluded his remarks by thanking many of the groups and individuals who helped the project be-come a reality, including the City of Vermillion, the Clay County Commission, the University of South Dakota, the state of South Dakota, the Governor's Office of Economic Development, the VCDC board of directors, the Vermillion School District, the Vermillion Now! project, First Dakota National Bank, Dakota Resources and Puetz Construction.

There have been so many wonderful people who have participated," Howe said.
