dances and a parade in Pierre. Officials on Wednesday said they expect public interest for South Dakota's 125 anniversary will be much lower than it was for the centennial

'We know there won't be that many major events this time around," said Jim Soyer, an aide to the governor who is working with the commission.

Commission Chairman Jim Larson of Sioux Falls, who was director of the 1989 centennial office, said the panel will seek suggestions before its next meeting.

"I'm certainly not ready to say we should do this or do that," Larson said.

Commission members said they want to explore working with North Dakota, which gained statehood on the same day South Dakota did on Nov. 2, 1889. Communities also will be encouraged to hold their own events, and state officials will work to get curriculum to schools for history classes.

Commission member Shelley Stingley of Sioux Falls, who was chair of the centennial commission, suggested that some money donated for next year's celebration could be used to establish endowments or scholarships for students studying South Dakota history.

Rep. Bernie Hunhoff, D-Yankton, suggested that next year's celebration be used to renew reconciliation efforts between American Indians and non-Indians. The late Gov. George Mickelson de clared 1990 as a year of reconciliation and later urged a longer effort at reconciliation.

Hunhoff said the commission should ask the public for ideas on continuing reconciliation efforts.

"That's something everybody could get excited about," Hunhoff said.

Officials said the 1989 centennial celebration used mail for communications and promotions. The 125th anniversary celebration will use the Internet, including Twitter and Facebook, to generate interest and announce events. The celebration's website is

at www.125.sd.gov Next year's celebration will be funded by donations and licensing the commercial use of the South Dakota 125th anniversary logo. The governor has said he does not expect to ask the 2014 Legislature for any funding for the anniversary.

Hunhoff said the goals of the celebration include bringing in additional tourists, helping younger residents gain a greater sense of pride in their home state and reaching out to the state's Native American reserva-

been pitched in the early stages of the planning process including rodeos, a potential Native American reconciliation project and a trans-border tug-of-war match with Nebraska.

Hunhoff said the public turnout was small for Wednesday's meeting but there has been substantial traffic to the website.

Daugaard says funding for the celebration will come from trademarking and merchandising of the 125th anniversary logo, no taxpayer money will be used. Hunhoff invites local sug-
