its participation numbers, Heine said. He pointed to fewer farm families. In addition, 4-Hers are pulled in many directions by other activities, which makes it particularly tough with livestock projects requiring a large commitment, he said.

However, he strongly believes in 4-H's role as a hands-on life learning experience.

"It's important," he said.

"The kids have the opportunity to step outside of their boundaries." Hawley agreed, noting 4-H

provides some of the best spotlights for livestock competitors.

Nielson also stressed the importance of exposing more people — especially the younger generation - to livestock and other aspects of farm life.

"A lot of people don't know where their food comes from," he said. "Education is such a big part of it.'
