South Dakota's Medicaid program now covers about 116,000 children, adults and disabled people. The expanded eligibility would add an estimated 48,500 people, mostly adults without children.

People earning up to 138 percent of the federal poverty level — \$15,451 for a single person or \$31,809 for a family of four — would be covered by an expansion. The federal government would fully cover spending on the extra people through 2016, and the state's contribution would rise in stages to 10 percent of the medical costs by 2020.

The task force estimates that if Medicaid is expanded, the state would pay about \$102 million through 2020 as its share of covering additional patients and administering the expanded program. The federal government would spend an extra \$2.1 billion in South Dakota for an expanded program from 2014 through 2020.

The Legislature earlier this year agreed with the governor's recommendation to delay a decision on expanding Medicaid after Daugaard said he is uncertain whether the federal government will be able to meet its pledge of paying most of the costs of expanding Medicaid. The task force recommended that if Daugaard and the Legislature approve an expansion, they should include a provision that ends the expansion if the federal government fails to pay its full 90 percent share of the costs after 2020.

However, Dave Hewett, president of the South Dakota Association of Healthcare Organizations, noted at Tuesday's meeting that the state's share of spending would a small part of the overall cost of expanding the program.

The task force's draft report found that expanding Medicaid could mean newly covered people seek preventive care earlier instead of waiting until they are very ill and get more expensive care in hospital emergency rooms. An expansion also could reduce deaths.

The additional spending on medical services also could boost the state economy. However, an additional 48,500 Medicaid recipients could strain a health care system that already has a shortage of primary care doctors, nurses and others, particularly in rural areas, the report said.

"How can we in any way possibly say there's not going to be a shortage if we have a shortage now," Bowman said.

Hospital officials said they have already pledged they will be able to care for the additional patients, but officials said dentists and mental health providers will have trouble caring for the added Medicaid patients.

The report also said even though the federal government would pay most of the cost of expanding Medicaid, additional state tax dollars would also be needed.

But Sen. Billie Sutton, D-Burke, said South Dakotans will pay federal income taxes to support the national health care overhaul even if the state does not expand Medicaid.

water in our office in two windows (located on the ground floor)," she said. "We need someone to look at all of the windows (in the building)." Commissioner Mark Johnson said the seals around a lot of the windows in the facility are bad.

"It's time to just get some new windows," Frenge stated.

In other business Tuesday, the commission:

- decided that approximately 30 patio shades erected in Larson's Landing without a building permit will have to be removed within 30 days. The commission unanimously voted that the structures are in violation of the zoning ordinance. Doug Larson, owner of Larson's Landing, argued that the patio shades, which are four poles with a roof, were not illegal. Many of the people who stay in Larson's Landing supported Larson's position, while a couple of individuals argued they were not acceptable. Ultimately, the commission agreed with Zoning Administrator Patrick Garrity that the patio shades qualify as structures in violation of the ordinance and said a variance would be needed if they are to be granted a building permit;
- was told by Dave Bartel, the James River Water Development District (JRWD) executive director, that the U.S. Geological Survey's (USGS) South Dakota Water Science Center in Rapid City is putting together a proposed package to study the mouth of the James River. The JRWD board of directors and Yankton County officials were among those that visited the mouth earlier this summer to investigate the large amount of siltation that has occurred. Bartel said he expects his board to consider the USGS package at its Sept. 12 meeting;
- decided to hold off a decision on whether to award a \$122,625 bid from James Steel for a storage facility near the Yankton County Ambulance Building at Eighth Street and Douglas Avenue. Auditor Patty Hojem needs to check with state auditors before a decision is made on where

the money for the project would come out of the county's budget. A special meeting may be held later this week to award the contract, since the bid is only good through the end of the month;

- agreed to increase the amount of the public defender contract with Fox, Youngberg and Lewno to \$10,500 per month in 2014. Currently, the firm is paid \$9,000 per month. It had requested \$15,000 per month, but the commission didn't think it could commit to that big of an increase given many other looming needs. The commissioners said they may look at annual cost-of-living adjustments for the contract in future years;
- agreed to allow the South Dakota Department of Transportation to place a digital sign on the Yankton County Courthouse and Safety Center property informing users of the Walnut Street and Fourth Street intersection that the traffic lights will be taken out of service as part of a study to see if they are needed;
- agreed to have Garrity do an analysis to determine what the county receives for the \$26,752 it pays Planning and Development District III annually through the Zoning Office. Additional payments are made for some projects, Garrity noted. "I believe we have talent and people within our own building that can do a lot of this, like comprehensive planning and other things. ... I think if we're going to become more sufficient, which makes us more sustainable, we need to be able to fund and finance some of our own pieces. I think it could be a wash if we take a good look at it. Maybe we can come up with a suggestion of paying them \$8,000 and, if we use them we use them, and if we don't, we don't";
- noted that phone system problems at the government center are persisting despite attempts to fix them; and
- held an executive session and afterward decided to increase the hours worked by the secretary shared by the Zoning Office and Highway Department from 35 to 40 a week.
